## **Front Cover: Council Logo**

Council members agreed to adopt the first (upper) of the logos appearing on the front cover of this Annual Report as the official logo of the Council at their General Meeting on 18 April 2011. The design of this logo has evolved through a number of versions over an extended period of time, including the 'ACT Umpire' logo used on umpires' shirts since the beginning of 2010/11, leading to a perceived need to settle on an 'official' logo representing the range of the Council's responsibilities. It is based on the Cricket ACT logo, which itself reflects Cricket Australia's preference that Australian cricketing organisations develop and use 'shield-based' logos. The Council is grateful for the permission of Cricket ACT to adapt their logo, and to the assistance of Darren Muir and his staff at Elect Printing in Fyshwick for their assistance with its production.

Some may perceive some loss of historical continuity in replacing the second (lower) logo. It has been used by the Council for about 26 years, subject only to the incorporation of "& Scorers" to reflect the change in the Council's functions and title in 2008-09.

Hence, this Annual Report represents something of an "official handover" from the former to the current Council logo.

## CHAIR

The season 2010/11 was a challenging one for the Council. The challenges included changes to the format of the ACTCA competitions, priorities for appointments set by the ACTCA, some reduction in the numbers, and availability, of members and difficult weather conditions. Our Appointments Panel did well to ensure that the overwhelming number of appointments were consistent with both the ACTCA's priorities and the Principles of Appointment established by the Council. These appointments required members to stand alone far more often than in previous seasons. Their readiness to do so was very much appreciated by the Council's Executive and the ACTCA.

During the 2010/11 season the Council retained the following priorities:

- a professional approach across-the-board to umpiring in the ACT;
- high quality, consistent umpiring;
- diligent, consistent enforcement of the "Spirit of the Game";
- a "fair go" in appointments;
- fair reward for time spent;
- constructive monthly meetings where focus would be on the Laws of Cricket and competition rules, field craft and player management; and
- constructive relations with the Board and Executive of ACT Cricket, with clubs, team captains and players.

The ratings of our umpires across-the-board were between good and very good; the number of players reported for conduct inconsistent with the "Spirit of the Game" was below that for the previous season, reflecting positively on both players and umpires alike; the Appointments Panel gave attention to addressing the concern expressed by some members during the previous season about being given insufficient opportunities to stand at higher level within the grade competition; the Grade Cricket Committee agreed to increases in expenses above the cost of living index ; umpire development was an item high on Council agendas throughout the year, and throughout the season the Council Executive played a full part in the ACT cricket community, including in the development of a new constitution and associated By-laws.

Once again the Council was exceptionally well served by its Deputy Chair, Secretary, Finance Officer and Panel Chairs and Members. The work of the High Performance Manager and Equipment Officer was also of the highest order.

High performance was accorded high priority during the season, both at State Panel level and grade level. The High Performance Manager introduced a constructive and taxing development program for members of the ACT State Panel and Emerging Umpires Panel. All Council members were encouraged to participate in some components of this program which included fitness sessions, sports psychology, professional seminars, standing in the NSW competition and general skills development. The program will be reviewed before the 2011/2012 season commences and will continue to be an important component of the Council's business.

Despite the Council conducting its annual Level 2 training program for new umpires and two umpires from other States joining our ranks, there was, as is commented on in detail in the report of the Executive, a noticeable decline in the number of umpires available to stand in the ACTCA competition. The fact that the competition was expanded to include separate two-day, one-day and men's Twenty20 competitions as well as two 'divisions' of women's competition strained the capacity of the Council to

stand members in matches in the lower grades. I intend, without neglecting the Council's other priorities, to make umpire recruitment and retention the highest priority for the Council during 2011/12.

The Council will continue to look for innovative means by which Level One umpires can be brought into a formal association with the Umpires and Scorers Council, be encouraged to take out Level 2 accreditation and become full and active members of the Council.

The efficacy of the post-match facilitation meetings continues to be of concern to the Council. The changes effected for the 2010/2011 season did not provide the results sought and this matter again will be one for continued consideration within the ACT cricket community. Constructive feedback on the performance of our members on the field is important for their development. The role of our Umpires' Observer is relevant in this regard but the Council regards constructive feedback from captains as more than useful input into umpire development.

The Council continued to enjoy a constructive relationship with the ACTCA executive. This included the negotiation of Key Performance Indicators for the Council and its members. These will be reviewed before the commencement of the 2011/2012 season.

The Council welcomed the decision of the Grade Cricket Committee to establish a formula for establishing expenses for umpires during the 2010/2011 to 2013/2014 seasons. The Council continues to consider that these expenses should be consistent with the mean of expenses for umpires standing in relatively similar competitions and will continue to work with the Committee to this end.

The Council made considerable efforts to attract a sponsor but was unsuccessful - the prevailing financial situation adversely affected its efforts.

Several umpires and scorers enjoyed the honour of being appointed to international matches played in Canberra, with the Prime Minister's XI hosting the touring England side in January, quickly followed by a series of three Twenty20 matches between the Australian and England women's teams.

However, the greatest honour of this kind belongs to Adam Morehouse, the scorers' representative on the Council Executive, who made his Test debut when appointed as a scorer for the Fifth Ashes Test in Sydney in January 2011. That Adam's appointment was made in his capacity as a member of the NSWCUA did not diminish the Council's pleasure in Adam's achievement.

The recognition of Council members for their contribution to cricket in the ACT has for too long been neglected. This year the Council provided awards recognising this contribution. Certificates were awarded to those standing on 200 or more days and in 50 or more first grade matches.

This was also the first year that the Founders' Award was presented. The recipient, who has stood for over 800 days and in over 150 first grade matches, and who has given outstanding service to the Council in all positions on the Executive was D.R.G. Gould.

Other awards<sup>1</sup> of the Council for the 2010/2011 season went to:

Best First Grade Umpire	Yohan Ramasundara;
Best Second Grade Umpire	Ron Reinhard;
Best First Year Umpire	Don Harding.

I wish to congratulate all who received awards this year and who were appointed to representative matches: moreover I wish to congratulate all members for their commitment to the Council throughout the season.

## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

### The Executive Committee

The Council's Executive consists of its Chair, Deputy Chair, Finance Representative, Secretary, Scorers' Representative and (Umpire) High Performance Manager (HPM): the HPM is the representative of the ACTCA Board on the Executive<sup>2</sup>. It was the practice throughout the season to invite other Council office holders (Manager Appointments, Manager Recruitment & Training, General Liaison Officer, and Equipment Officer) to attend meetings of the Executive Committee when relevant matters were to be discussed. Other Council members also were invited to attend meetings where they could contribute to particular agenda items, and all meetings were open to any Council member.

The Committee convened on ten occasions during 2010/11, meeting once a month from August until April with an additional meeting in June. Meetings were held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Canberra Services Club (until April 2011- see below), commencing at 5.30pm. Agendas for, and minutes of, the meetings were posted on the Council's web site ([www.actumpires.com](http://www.actumpires.com)) as a way of facilitating the accountability of elected office holders, as well as keeping members informed about the issues being considered by the Executive. The assistance of our Web Master, Chris Cahill, is invaluable in this process. Inevitably, not all office holders were able to attend all meetings during the year (Table 1).

### General Meetings

Seven general meetings of Council members were held between September and April. These meetings are usually held on the third Monday of each month from September to April, with no meeting in March to facilitate attendance at the Council's Annual Dinner. The December meeting, which was primarily a social gathering, was brought forward by a week to minimise clashes with other pre-Christmas commitments.

An effort was made to maintain the focus of meetings on 'practical umpiring', including Laws/rules and umpiring-related developments within Cricket Australia and the Cricket

ACT (CACT). The January meeting included a presentation by Chris Doyle, CACT's Grade Cricket Operations Manager, and the February meeting included a workshop led by a Sydney sports psychology consultant, Alan Mantle, arranged by Terry Keel. Both meetings had above season-average attendance by members.

Nevertheless, only a combined total of 143 members attended these seven meetings, giving a mean attendance of 20.4 members. The ACTCA Constitution stipulates 15 members as the quorum for a Council General Meeting. This attendance reflects the decline in 2010/11 membership discussed below, and continues the steady decline of recent years in meeting attendances (down from means of 25 in 2009/10, 27.5 in 2008/09, and 31.2 in 2007/08<sup>3</sup>), and varying from 25 at the always-popular October meeting to 18 at the September and April meetings. More than half that number of members recorded their apologies for being unable to attend (78, with a mean of 11.1 and a variation from 7 in October to 13 in November, January and April). There are many possible interpretations of what these figures indicate about the trend in commitment to the Council (including training and development) amidst the 'time poverty' of our age, but they do appear to lend support to the need for attention to be given to the Council's recruitment and retention policies and practices.

### **Council Working Groups**

The Council continued to make some use of working groups, including office holders and other members, as a method of preparing recommendations for reform of its operations. This season has seen working groups addressing:

- (i) details of the criteria to be used in establishing eligibility for Council Recognition Awards; and

- (ii) the reconvening of the Working Group on Awards to consider Terry Keel's recommendation for reforming the process for electing the winner of the Council's McCarty Medal.

Bryan Climas, with assistance from Andy Turner, has continued in his role as a one-person working group to collate a draft of a revised set of Council Standing Minutes, and - more recently - to liaise with the Council and ACTCA to integrate the SMs with a revised ACTCA Constitution and new set of By-laws.

Thanks are owed to the members who devote time and effort to the discussions and reporting involved in such working groups in light of the prominent role assigned to them in designing the Council's operations.

## Membership

The Executive has devoted much of its time to recognising and rewarding the commitment of the Council's members at the same time as it has become concerned about an enduring decline in the number of active umpires. Hence, recruitment and retention policies and practices will be subject to review and, probably, reform during 2011/12. These are complex issues with many variables.

The data in Table 2 cannot provide answers, but they do begin to suggest some of the questions that might warrant consideration in that pending review.

The stability of these statistics is more striking than sudden changes. Our 'standing umpire' membership has dropped below 40 in only two of the past ten seasons, and in the same period it has never been higher than 48. However, not only is 2010/11's figure of 36 standing umpires the lowest of the decade, it also provides the only instance in which that number has declined in three successive seasons. The absolute number of standing umpires may be only marginally below that of 2004/05, but the consistent downward trend resulting in a drop of 25 per cent in the number of standing umpires since the 2007/08 peak may be a greater concern.

The total number of 'standing days'<sup>6</sup> was at its highest (954) in the first year of the decade under review, and has not exceeded 900 since 2003/04. The 2010/11 total of 673 days is the lowest of the decade and the only occasion in that period when the Council has failed to reach 700 'standing days'. However, the wettest cricket season in nearly forty years contributed to that outcome, with no appointments being made on at least a couple of weekends and many other games being abandoned without any play.

This annual figure is the product of three variables:

- a. total number of standing umpires;
- b. mean (average) number of days stood per umpire; and
- c. proportion of umpires who stood on more than the mean number of days<sup>7</sup>.

It might be useful to interrogate the data further to reveal any other important trends in the total number of days stood, such as the number of days stood in grade cricket matches compared with any trends in other competitions.

One of the surprisingly stable statistics throughout the decade is the size of the Council's 'core membership' of umpires who stand in more than the mean ('average') number of days per season: 2010/11 was the only season in which that figure fell below 20 umpires and it never rose higher than 26 umpires. Table 2 provides evidence suggesting, prior to 2010/11, a strong inverse relationship between the number of members and the proportion of those members who stand on more than the mean number of days: in other words, as the number of standing umpires grows, there is a tendency for a larger proportion of them to stand less often. However, in the past season both the number of standing members and the 'core membership' declined to the point where 44 per cent of the active umpires accounted for 75 per cent of the days stood (16 members accounted for 509 days, with a mean of nearly 32 days per 'core member').

It seems that the Council is heavily reliant on the regular availability of about twenty members (or about half of the total number of standing umpires). This suggests an array of risks to be managed in any reform of recruitment and retention. For example, what are the risks in, say, an attempt to 'broaden the base' of umpires who stand more frequently throughout the season? What, if any, part might rapid progress towards the 'targets' established in the eligibility criteria for the Council's Achievement Awards for days stood, and first grade matches play in motivating 'core members' to stand more frequently? Furthermore, if there is any 'causal relationship' between the variables, Table 2 is silent about its existence and/or direction. For example, *if* there is a causal

relationship between the history of appointments and variations in membership numbers, is it that the 'core membership' is shouldering an increasing proportion of the 'umpiring burden' because members are leaving the Council; or are members leaving the Council because they perceive that the bulk of appointments go to an established 'core membership'?

There is a lot for the pending review of recruitment and retention to mull over.

## Other Council Activities

In a volunteer organisation, thanks are due to every member who made any contribution to the burden of umpiring, scoring and/or administration, along with the families, friends and others who missed out on the time and energy that was devoted to ACT cricket. Meshing the expectations and activities of volunteers and paid officials is no small challenge, so our thanks are due to Mark Vergano and his staff at Cricket ACT for all their assistance and support, with the usual expectations of improving our respective performances next year.

As usual, the season started with the Annual Training Seminar in August, and we are indebted once again to Bill Ruse (succeeded by Andrew Shelley) and the other members of the Recruitment and Training Panel, and all those they cajoled or otherwise persuaded to provide assistance.

This year's Annual Dinner was again held at Legends Restaurant in Manuka, under the, by now, experienced guidance of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Alex Fyfe: thanks again for their commitment and organisational skills under Barry's leadership. Catherine, Andrew Shelley, and Bill Ruse – with the assistance of at least Damian Eason, Shannon Bushell, Nick Ewbank, Graeme Clifton and Ken Brazel - walked the extra kilometres to manage not only the election process for the Council's annual awards, but also the *demanding* processes of identifying those eligible for Achievement Awards and preparing the Awards. Special thanks are due to Catherine for her patience and poise under the pressure that goes with chairing the Annual Awards Committee.

In a season in which the ACT's various representative teams achieved so much on the field of play, it is appropriate to congratulate the members of the ACT State Panel (Simon, Lightbody, Yohan Ramasundara, and Andrew Shelley, along with Damian Eason on our Emerging Umpires Panel), under the guidance of Terry Keel in his first year as the Council's (Umpire) High Performance Manager.

The Council's 'core business' remains the appointing of umpires to CACT matches. This onerous responsibility falls to our Appointments Panel, who had to cope not only with the expectations of a declining number of available umpires, but also the vagaries of the wettest summer for nearly forty years. It is appropriate to record our thanks to Graeme Clifton, Ron Reinhard, Nick Ewbank (*ex officio*, Umpires' Observer) and Terry Keel (*ex officio*, High Performance Manager), with the administrative support of Damian Eason, for their commitment to the most scrutinised and contentious of Council responsibilities.

The Grade Cricket Committee (GCC) is the body that runs the Grade competition, and the Council is represented on it by the Deputy Chairman; all of the eight clubs plus the Women's Council also have a single representative on the GCC. Decisions concerning the format of games and by-laws are decided in this forum.

This season, the GCC also discussed the remuneration of umpires, a case that was presented forcefully by Ken Brazel. The outcome of these discussions was an increase in Umpires' expenses, with planning for 'out years' put in place.

Indeed, the compromise solution that was reached on expenses was representative of the prevailing good will and commonsense which characterised GCC discussions all season. While some of the GCC's decisions may not always be universally lauded, they were all carefully considered, and done in a spirit of co-operation between clubs.

Many of the matters discussed at GCC are of marginal significance to umpires and scorers per se (eg the registration of players), but the Council's views are welcomed and respected by the clubs.

Usually, GCC meetings are held the evening before Council Executive meetings, and the outcomes of GCC meetings are typically shared by email the evening of the meeting, for discussion at the Executive if required. Significant matters are reported to General Meetings of the Council, usually the following week.

### **The Canberra Services Club, Manuka**

The Council has had its 'base' at the premises of the Canberra Services Club, at the junction of Canberra Avenue and Manuka Circle adjacent to the main entrance to Manuka Oval, since the late 1990s. The Club has provided space for the Council's General, Executive and Annual meetings as well as many training courses and Annual Training Seminars as part of its community support obligations. Members of the Council have been welcomed as Club members, making use of its bar, dining room and more general hospitality. The Club's staff have been welcoming hosts and supporters of the Council's members and its business.

The loss of the Club's heritage-listed premises to fire between about 5.30 and 7.30 on the morning of Thursday 28 April, only a matter of weeks before celebrating the seventieth anniversary of their opening in May 1941 as a hospitality venue for members of the war-time armed services, is a cause of sadness for many, including Council members.

The Executive is continuing to liaise with the Club about its plans for trading and building new premises. In the meantime, arrangements have been made to hold the July 2011 Annual Meeting at the Italo-Australian Club in Franklin Street, Forrest, and the Executive is liaising with that Club and two others (Eastlakes in Kingston and Canberra in Civic) about finding a base for the Council from the beginning of the 2011/2012 season, pending information about the future of the Services Club. The Executive is grateful for the assistance of these three organisations, and for the assistance provided by Cricket ACT in providing space in its Bradman Pavilion offices for the Executive's June meeting.

## FINANCE OFFICER

The budget for this year was for a deficit of \$3,400. The final outcome was a deficit of \$2,765.74, which means that we performed close to expectations. There were, however, some significant changes between various cost centres. The budget for merchandise purchases and merchandise sales was only \$400 each. However, the Executive decided that as the umpire shirts which were funded by a sponsor a few seasons ago were wearing out, it was time to get new stock. As no sponsor could be found to pay for the new shirts, they were sold to our members at cost (\$50 each). The cost to our budget was minimal as most of the newly purchased stock was sold.

Another significant change to the budget was the Executive's decision to reward various milestones achieved by our members with suitably engraved pewter tankards. The cost of these (\$1,145) was covered by the underspending in the 'Fees Paid – Umpires' cost centre which funds the annual umpire bonuses. Out of the budget of \$3,500 in that cost centre only \$2,160 was spent.

The income from membership subscriptions has fallen from \$2,671 last season to \$2,210.

This year's seminar was held at the Canberra Services Club. We incurred a small deficit of \$21 for seminar catering. This was more than covered by the proceeds of a raffle held during the event which raised \$85.

As in the previous year, this season's Umpires Annual Dinner was held at the Legend's Spanish Restaurant in Manuka. The Organising Committee, headed by Barry Thomas and Catherine Polglase, did an excellent job in organising this event. The overall deficit for the dinner was \$264 which was in line with expectations.

Income from the Development Levy showed a decrease from \$749 in 2009/2010 to \$675. The decrease illustrates the problem the Council had in attracting umpires to stand this season. The number of standing days in Men's Grade decreased from 590 to 431.

The following table shows the amounts received by umpires during last season.

The daily average in 2009/2010 was \$84.52 (\$63,307.50 for 749 umpiring days).

Finally, as reported above, the umpire bonus system was again operating this season. Twelve members each received \$180.00 for a total outlay of \$2,160.00.

### SCORERS' REPRESENTATIVE

The 2010/11 season for the ACT Scorers Committee was again a busy time in terms of representative scoring commitments and our relationship with the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council and Cricket ACT. The Scorers' Committee once again consisted of Judith Hall, Rob Hall and Catherine Polglase. I thank the Committee for their hard work this season and hope to see them all back on the committee for the following season. Saying this, we were one member short on the Committee again for the duration of the season and the Committee is always on the lookout for interested scorer members to be part of the Committee. The Scorers' Representative, Adam Morehouse, and Catherine Polglase acted as the scorer selection panel for the 2009/10 season. Also, a big thank you is due to the Council Executive, especially Andy Turner and Ken Brazel, for all their help in the past season, and to Chris Doyle and Mark Vergano at Cricket ACT for all their assistance.

The annual scorers training night, under the auspices of the NSW Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association and the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council, was held in September with 20 interested people attending. A new venue hosted the evening, with thanks to Lake Ginninderra College for allowing the Committee to use the venue, and hopefully for many years to come. There was great interest in the evening with over half attempting the basic scorer's exam. To date seven people have passed the exam, beginning their

first steps on becoming a regular scorer. My thanks go to Darren Goodger, Development Manager of the NSWCUA, and Merilyn Fowler, chairperson of the NSW Scorer's Committee, for their continued support in running this annual training evening.

The representative commitment for scorers this season was heavy and it was a credit to those scorers who put their names forward to score representative matches this season. In addition to ACT Meteors and ACT Comets matches, scorers were required for the Prime Minister's XI, three Twenty20 Internationals between Australia and England, and the Cricket Australia Women's Cup. The scorer's selection panel was able to again appoint scorers for all representative matches and for the first time were able to appoint to all matches of the Cricket Australia Women's Cup. The CA Women's Cup was a total of 48 scorer appointments for a total of 24 matches. This was a feat which the scorer selection panel had not previously achieved and one which we will attempt to match in future seasons.

Darren Mattison, Andrew Moyes, Maria Picker, Catherine Polglase and Peter Vels were appointed to Women's National Cricket League and WNCL Twenty20 matches. Liam Baker, Judith Hall, Darren Mattison, Andrew Moyes and Catherine Polglase were appointed to Futures League matches. Congratulations must go to Liam Baker who scored his first Futures League match in November. Liam has an excellent future in scoring and has recently completed his first full season as a first grade scorer with the Queanbeyan District Cricket Club.

Catherine Polglase and Darren Mattison were selected to score the Prime Minister's XI match against England in January. Darren Mattison, Catherine Polglase, Rammanee Shivakkumar and Anne Sutherland scored the Women's Twenty20 Internationals between Australia and England in January.

Cricket ACT hosted the Cricket Australia Women's Cup during the 2010/11 season. As mentioned earlier in the report, all matches had official scorer appointed to them. All teams had a scorer linked to their side as well which made the task of identifying players and building a rapport with the side advantageous. Liam Baker, Judith Hall, Darren Mattison, Andrew Moyes, Maria Picker, Catherine Polglase, Rammanee Shivakkumar and Anne Sutherland all scored during the Cricket Australia Women's Cup.

On a personal note, I would like to thank all of the members of the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council who passed on their best wishes to me following my appointment to the 5th Ashes Test at the Sydney Cricket Ground in January. It was an amazing experience, something that I will remember for the rest of my life. I am proud to have come from Canberra to score the match and I would not have been able to reach those heights without the support from my family and those people from the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council, Cricket ACT and Weston Creek Cricket Club.

I would like to thank all scorer members who took time from their lives to score representative, grade and school cricket during the 2010/11 season. A number of people scored for the first time at grade and school level and I hope some of those and those who attended the scorer's training night will put their hand up to score at representative level in the future. The next few years will be a challenge for the Scorers' Committee. The Committee has been a stable unit for the past few seasons but it may be time for some new blood. It would be nice for some scorer members to put their hand up to join the Committee in the next season or future seasons.

## HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER

I took on the role of Umpire's High Performance Manager (HPM) at the start of this season, in the knowledge that the role has changed quite significantly from what it had been previously. My vision for the role was and is that the HPM should be someone who can help with the overall development of all of our umpires, and in particular our best-performing umpires - hopefully well enough to help them to progress further along the Cricket Australia (CA) Pathway.

### ACT State Panel and CA Pathways

With that in mind, I selected a small group - our High Performance Panel - of our best up and coming umpires and designed a development/training programme for them, which was to be run over the course of the season. This season's Panel comprised of Simon Lightbody, Yohan Ramasundara and Andrew Shelley, with Damian Eason appointed to a newly-created Development Panel. In selecting umpires to populate the Panel, I looked to include umpires who have shown ability and a willingness to commit to their further development as umpires, and who were considered to have the potential to progress along the CA Pathway.

I also had an eye to CA's template of representative umpires. CA places great store in fostering for their programmes umpires with a high level of natural ability as decision-makers, as well as appropriate fitness and flexibility in keeping with the modern image of a representative cricket umpire - gone are the days of the big, fat, immobile cricket umpire, at least in televised CA matches it seems! CA is also mindful that umpires who are going to form part of the CA Pathway need to be young enough to allow for them to progress along the Pathway at an expected rate, such that they would not be considered too old by the time they reach the end of the Pathway.

### Umpire Development Programme

The development programme included fortnightly fitness sessions run by Chris Males' Pro-Fit organisation and attending presentations by various people from the wider sporting community, including a high-profile Rugby Union referee, a sports psychologist, and a day which the team spent with Denis Burns and Sean Cary (CA's Development Manager and Umpire Manager, respectively). I was able to arrange for some of our Panel members to stand during the season in Sydney Grade matches. While this placed a strain on our local umpiring availability resources, this proved to be a very beneficial development opportunity for the umpires concerned, as they were able to experience umpiring high-standard matches in a foreign environment, applying unfamiliar playing conditions.

The group, together with a number of other interested members, also travelled to Goulburn for a presentation by Darren Goodger, Cricket NSW's Umpire Development Manager. Darren's interactive session was very well received by all who attended, as he was able to draw on his first-class and extensive grade cricket experience to give attendees valuable insight into the challenges confronting representative umpires. All the information and physical fitness sessions were opened to the broader membership, as well as the High Performance Panel members, and pleasingly, a lot of members availed themselves of the opportunity to attend these sessions, although (perhaps not surprisingly ☺) no one from outside the Panel turned up for the physical fitness sessions.

## Panel Performance

On the field, the members of the High Performance Panel acquitted themselves with distinction, generally officiating in their Futures League and Women's CA Cup matches very well. Simon Lightbody and Damian Eason represented our Council capably at this season's Under 19 and Under 17 Championships, respectively. The reports received from UHPP observers generally reflected the good performances of our Panel members, although there were some areas identified for improvement.

After the completion of the season, there was a meeting of all the States and Territories' State Directors of Umpiring (SDU), hosted in Melbourne by Cricket Australia. Due to a prior engagement, I was unfortunately unable to attend, however Bill Ruse kindly stood in for me. The SDU meeting discussed a range of issues impacting on the way in which emerging and first class umpires are managed, and was an opportunity for the SDU's to share with their counterparts the issues affecting them.

Bill reported to the meeting about issues such as the decrease in the number of active Level 2 umpires in the ACT this season, and the strategies being contemplated to reverse this trend. He also raised with CA the need for our high-performing umpires to receive frank advice from CA regarding the prospects for their progression (or obstacles to it) along the CA Pathway, where the umpire is not willing to relocate to a State capital city in order to advance his or her opportunities for progression.

## EQUIPMENT OFFICER

In this, my second year as the ACTCAU&SC Equipment Officer, equipment matters have really taken off. There is an old adage that says "if you want to be the part, you have to look the part". With this in mind, a complete revamp of uniforms was initiated with the view to improving the comfort of our members whilst transforming the professionalism in a visual way.

### New Equipment

Last financial year, the Executive endorsed a decision to supply new Umpiring Shirts for actively standing umpires plus Polo shirts for travelling to and from matches for actively standing umpires. This endorsement was subsequently increased to include on-field Jackets.

Coopers Teamwear was selected as the preferred supplier of uniforms and the Executive issued a directive at the Annual Seminar, due to excessive attempts at garnering sponsorship funds, to start placing firm orders to enable umpires to be seen in identical garments. It was proposed that all umpires needed to be in possession of one of the new shirts otherwise they would not be considered for appointment in the upcoming season. Due to some clashing commitments from the manufacturer, the new shirts were not available for distribution until the Council's General Meeting of 18 October 2010.

Polo shirts were ordered in early January 2011 with a hopeful delivery after 8 weeks. Due to a number of reasons including but not limited to Chinese New Year, Tomb Sweeping Day (yes, that's right....look it up on the Internet), Winter Sport orders,

Design rationalisation etc. the polos were not received until early April whilst the Jackets arrived in early June for disbursement at the Annual General Meeting.

The designs of the new garments were such as to have colour patterns "opposite" to the on-field shirts while the jackets are designed to have the same colouring as the on-field shirts. This enables one umpire to wear a jacket while the other is not and still be dressed "alike". Artwork for all three garments is as shown below;

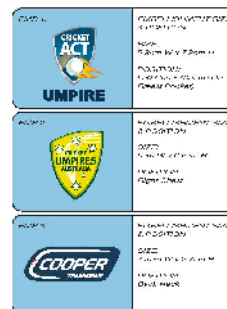

## UMPIRES' OBSERVER

The first major event of season 2010/11 was the Annual Seminar. At the Seminar a draft Observer's Report form was tabled, based largely on material from Cricket Australia's *Performance Criteria for Umpires* (May 2010). There was also a discussion of what can and would be observed from beyond the boundary. Anyone who is interested in standing beyond grade cricket should take the opportunity to review that CA document (as long-winded as it is!).

Following feedback from members (thanks particularly to Graeme Clifton and Yohan Ramasundara), a final version of the report form was tabled at the first meeting of the season. Experience during the year would suggest that it worked fairly well (although it does need a couple of small tweaks). Sadly, other documentation wasn't as forthcoming.

I refer specifically to the Captains' Reports on Umpires. I received a total of 63 for the season, with a disproportionate number coming from Women's games. This is a derisory number, given that there should have been some around 300! Obviously, the weather (which so badly affected the season overall) had a negative impact on the perceived worth of completing reports on umpires.

The other form of information on which the Observer acts is, of course, direct observation of umpires. This was done predominantly, but not exclusively, before Christmas, with the first observations done on 9 October, and the last during the semi-finals in March. A total of 32 games, representing 55 formal observations of members, were completed. Emphasis was laid on observing umpires who were either new to umpiring (too few alas!) or were being considered for promotion to a higher grade. However, the members of the representative panel and the High Performance Manager were also observed. Indeed, with one exception, all umpires who stood regularly in Saturday matches were observed and provided with formal feedback at least once across the season.

A combination of the observations and the (limited) Captains' Reports suggest that the overall standard of umpiring in Canberra is acceptable. The average mark awarded by Captains was 3.76 (out of a possible 5). Observations suggested that there were few systemic issues – perhaps the most commonly noted flaw was a tendency for umpires to move their head after checking for front foot no-balls, as the ball is propelled down the wicket. 'Tic-tac-toe' could be more consistently used, even by some of our more experienced members. Alas, it is also the case that some umpires need to think more deeply about the question of how far down the track a batsman has to be before he shouldn't be given out LBW – towards the end of the season, I saw photographic evidence that this old problem is still around!

One of the key roles that the Observer performs is as a member of the Appointments Committee. Before you mutter much about this body, think about whether you would have the dedication and interest to turn up almost every Wednesday evening during the season – for up to two hours! Discussion at the Appointments meetings was frank and honest – all umpires' performances were discussed.

I'd like to thank the members of the Council for the opportunity to fulfil this role: it has been a rewarding one, and has given me the opportunity (and the reason) to engage many members of Canberra's cricketing family in discussions. Looking ahead to the coming season, it is obvious that recruitment is in urgent need of attention, and I urge the Executive to give this matter detailed and urgent consideration!

Oh, and in case you've forgotten, the result in the Ashes series was 3-1 to ENGLAND, with the three victories all being by an innings!

I was delighted to be appointed to the above carnival. Unfortunately the carnival was severely impacted by rain and the dreadful flooding Brisbane experienced. Some umpires and teams, through sheer luck of appointments to particular venues, managed to get more cricket than others.

All 4 games on day 1 of the carnival were scheduled to be played at the playing fields belonging to Brisbane Grammar School. This is an impressive and extensive array of some 6 cricket fields. Three of the games were completely washed out and only an hour or so of play was possible on the ground that had the best drainage. One of the scheduled rest days was cancelled and all games scheduled for day 1 were played on this rest day.

Indeed, through the carnival some grounds had to be changed because of the sheer amount of water covering them.

Unfortunately EVERY game I was appointed to was rain affected. Although the unfortunate aspect of this was that there wasn't as much cricket played as everyone would have liked, the fortunate part of it was that it ensured umpires were right up to speed with playing conditions and re calculations of overs required etc.

## IMPARJA CUP

I was both delighted and honoured to be given the opportunity to attend the Imparja Cup at Alice Springs 6-13 February 2011. Once I learned of my nomination to go to Alice Springs I thought, "great – a week of uninterrupted matches and no rain!" given the reputation and historical precedence

We were able to begin proceedings on 9 February with the format of the tournament modified to a complete Twenty/20 affair. ## AWARDS

The structure and processes for awarding the Council's annual awards were subject to extensive reform during 2009/10, following the acceptance of a range of recommendations from the Council's Working Group on Awards. These changes continued during 2010/11, with the adoption of the change of name from the Chairman's Award to the Founders' Medal<sup>8</sup>, and the initial presentation of Council Recognition (or Achievement) Awards to currently active members and Life Members who had stood in a minimum of 50 first grade matches and/or on a minimum of 200 days. The criteria for eligibility for both forms of Recognition Award have been amended to recognise *appointment* rather than actual *standing* from the commencement of the 2010/11 season; this change acknowledges that the Council is intending to recognise and reward the availability of members for *appointment* without the intervention of such factors as weather which might reduce opportunities to *stand* (see pages 35-6).
