CHAIR

The 2011/12 season was a very sad one for the Council. Derek Gould, a life member, who had served the Council and its earlier identities for nearly 40 years, died on 25 December 2011.

Derek had held at one time or other virtually all executive positions on the Council. He stood on more than 800 days and officiated at over 500 first grade games including first grade grand finals. He had become, in the context of umpiring in the ACT, a legend in his life time. The respect in which he was held within the Council and the wider ACT cricket community was comprehensively displayed by the numbers who attended his funeral service. The Council has decided that, in view of Derek's close involvement in the promotion of women's cricket in the ACT, the annual award for the best umpire officiating in the Women's Premier League be named the Derek Gould Memorial Award.

The 2011/12 season was again a challenging one for the Council as it strives to meet the priorities of Cricket ACT. I commend the readiness of members to make themselves available on a regular basis and of the Appointments Panel to make appointments consistent with the priorities of Cricket ACT and the principles of appointment established by the Council. One pleasing development was the recruitment of several new umpires this season who have displayed strong commitment to standing regularly and developing their knowledge of the Laws of Cricket and their field craft.

The Council appreciates the initiatives of the Board of Cricket ACT in the promotion of cricket in the ACT and surrounding region and its successful endeavours to bring a new range of international and interstate matches to Canberra. Besides promoting interest in cricket in the ACT, these initiatives give further encouragement to those members of the Council who wish to stand at the highest levels. In this regard I note that Members of our High Performance Panel have received commendation from Cricket Australia representatives for their performance at matches under the auspices of Cricket Australia - Simon Lightbody being appointed by Cricket Australia to the Under 19 National Championships.

The Council also welcomed the Board's approval of a revised Constitution and By Laws. Against that background the Executive finalised, for consideration at the 2012 AGM, its revision of the Council's Standing Minutes.

The Council again appreciated the cooperative approach Cricket ACT applies to its relationship with the Council. It welcomed the strong contribution of Chris Doyle to the promotion of grade cricket in the ACT. The end of match facilitation process continues to be a focus of our consultations. It has potential to promote significantly the development of our members and deserves being accorded high priority by all involved. The Council was delighted to hear of the selection of Nathan Lyon, with whom many members have stood, to the Australian test and one day teams during the season.

I am of the firm view that the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Council should not serve more than two successive terms in those positions. Organisations need to introduce fresh ideas and fresh personalities. As such I am not nominating to continue as Chair of the Council.

At the commencement of my term as Chair I noted that the priorities of the executive would be to promote:

- a professional approach to umpiring
- high quality, consistent umpiring
- consistent enforcement of the "Spirit of the Game"

- a "Fair Go" in appointments
- fair reward for time spent
- constructive monthly meetings with focus on laws, competition rules, field craft and man management; and
- constructive relations with the Board, the executive of ACT Cricket, with clubs, team captains and players

Priorities 1, 2, 3 and 6 were pursued through their being the focus of monthly meetings with the formal discussion of laws, rules and field craft being complemented by informal discussion of issues which arose during games including those relating to the Spirit of the Game. These priorities were, as they had been in the past, the focus of the annual seminar. The change of the seminar to a one-day formula is one which I support in terms of encouraging tight content and encouraging member attendance throughout the seminar period. The executive's concern about promotion of the Spirit of the Game has been reflected in its support for members attending hearings of the Disciplinary Committee and the attendance by the Chair at meetings of the Disciplinary Committee where matters of particular concern were to be addressed.

Within these priorities a focus was accorded to the High Performance Panel. The planning and implementation of the program for the panel was impressively developed over past four years. Those seen as having good potential to be included on the panel were encouraged to participate in the program and elements of the program were made open to all interested members. I hope this initiative will be continued and perhaps expanded.

A "Fair Go" in appointments has been promoted by the establishment of Appointments Principles and the establishment of requirements on the Umpires Observer in terms of coverage of standings and reporting to umpires. Members were also made aware that they were entitled to discuss appointments constructively with the Appointments Panel. I consider the perception of getting a fair go in appointments a key element in promoting harmony within the Council and umpire retention.

A fair reward for time spent has been promoted through representation with ACT Cricket and the Grade Cricket Committee. Payment for expenses has increased to a level which members consider significantly address the issues in the current financial situation facing clubs and Cricket ACT, and have endorsed the rate of increase proposed by the Grade Cricket Committee for the year ahead.

The executive has ensured attendance at all meetings of the ACT Cricket Association and given high priority to attendance at meetings of the Grade Cricket Committee. One issue of concern to clubs addressed effectively was umpire appointments policy where the clubs presented their interests while recognising the constraints affecting our Appointments Panel. The formal meetings between the executive and representatives of Cricket ACT which were introduced served well to address issues of concern. Umpires were made aware of the expectation that they would develop their communications with captains, including through meeting with captains prior to the toss and engaging with captains early if incidents arose during matches which may affect the Spirit of the Game.

I think these priorities which were put into effect by Council members were instrumental in the high rating of the standard of umpiring by Council members accorded by the CEO of Cricket ACT and the Manager Grade Cricket.

Our members should continue to accord high priority to this expectation.

Recruitment and retention are issues which have been the subject of concern to the executive in recent seasons. It has sought to promote retention by endeavours to promote

morale, including through the promotion of confidence in fair treatment in appointments, in the Council's recognition of high levels of performance and long- service and through team building measures. These measures may have had some success. The executive's initiatives to promote recruitment through liaison with clubs and Level One Umpires have unfortunately not been successful. However, as noted during the 2011/12 season a number of new umpires joined the Council, all of whom have shown readiness to play a strong role in the Council. Their membership is most welcome.

The Scorers Chapter continues to perform outstandingly. This was reflected in the appointment of Adam Morehouse to stand at the international level. The appointment not only reflects well on the Scorers Chapter but on the Council as a whole. Our scorer members continued to receive strong commendation for their performances in servicing games conducted under the auspices of Cricket Australia. The Chapter is more or less autonomous in its functioning. However, the executive was very pleased to assist the Chapter when approached including in pursuing its interests with Cricket ACT. The Chapter continues to make a strong contribution to the running of the executive and to the Council in general, including through our social activities.

The Council is an organisation of volunteers, all of whom have interests and responsibilities outside the Council - business, work, family and others. It is for members to determine how these interests will be balanced. I would like to extend my appreciation to all members of the Council for the contribution they are making to the promotion of cricket in the ACT and indeed the surrounding region.

Lastly, I am pleased to report that although the new executive will have continuing issues to address, the executive will not leave it with outstanding business as such as all current business was signed off at the current executive's last meeting.

It has been a privilege to serve the Council as its Chair and I look forward to contributing to the promotion of cricket in the ACT through an active role in the Council on and off the field.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Council's Executive consists of its Chair, Deputy Chair, Finance Representative, Secretary, Scorers' Representative and (Umpire) High Performance Manager: the HPM is the representative of the ACTCA Board on the Executive. At times during the season, other Council office holders (Manager Appointments, Manager Recruitment & Training, General Liaison Officer, and Equipment Officer) were invited to attend meetings of the Executive Committee when relevant matters were to be discussed. There was a standing invitation to any Council member to attend as an observer (however no member took this offer up).

The Committee convened on four occasions during 2011-12, usually meeting once a month during the season. Meetings were usually held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Italo-Australian Club. Agendas for, and minutes of, the meetings were posted on the Council's web site (www.actumpires.com) as a way of facilitating the accountability of elected office holders, as well as keeping members informed about the issues being considered by the Executive. The assistance of our Web Master, Chris Cahill, is invaluable in this process. Inevitably, not all office holders were able to attend all meetings during the year (Table 1 below).

The Executive welcomed a new member after the 2011 AGM, with Stuart Grocock taking over the role of Secretary from the redoubtable Andy Turner. Sadly, the demands of the role meant that Stu felt he was unable to continue with two roles (Secretary and Equipment Officer) and he resigned in January 2012. Don Harding kindly accepted the Executive's invitation to fulfil the role until the end of the season.

Adam Morehouse's other responsibilities meant that he also found attendance at Executive meetings challenging, and Catherine Polglase kindly agreed to act as a standing proxy for Adam.

General Meetings

Seven general meetings of Council members were held between September and April. These meetings are usually held on the third Monday of each month from September to April, with no meeting in March to facilitate attendance at the Council's Annual Dinner. The December meeting morphed into a Christmas function at Black Mountain Peninsula.

The effort to focus meetings on 'practical umpiring', including Laws/rules and umpiring-related developments within Cricket Australia and the ACTCA, was continued.

Nevertheless, only a combined total of 160 members attended these seven meetings, giving a mean attendance of 22.9 members. Although this attendance reflects a decline compared to 2010-11, membership of the Council increased slightly during the season.

Membership

The 2011-12 saw the downward trend (since 2007-08) in membership halted and, indeed, there was a slight increase in active umpire numbers. This was fortunate indeed because although the 2011-12 season was again adversely impacted by weather, the overall number of days umpires were asked to stand increased over the previous season. Again, the Council was not able to provide umpires for all days of cricket actually played under the auspices of Cricket ACT.

In its 2010-11 Annual Report, the Council's highlighted the fact that it is heavily reliant on the regular availability of about 20 members (or about half of the total number of standing umpires). Over the course of last season, nothing much has changed and, in fact, has become somewhat worse. While the table below is self explanatory, it is worthy of further comment.

The table reflects that 20 members umpired more than 19 days of cricket during 2011-12. That might seem broadly in line with the trend since 2001-02. However, all is not what it seems. As was the case last season, a relatively low number of members took on the bulk of the umpiring workload in 2011-12.

In 2010-11, 44 per cent of the active umpires accounted for 75 per cent of the days stood (16 members accounted for 509 days, with a mean of nearly 32 days per 'core member').

During the 2011-12, 50 per cent of the active umpires accounted for 77 per cent of the days stood (19 members accounted for 575 days with a mean of 30 days per 'core member'.

Increasingly, the Council is reliant on fewer members standing more often and this is not sustainable in the longer term. While reluctant to make this observation, the age profile of the current membership is, or should be, of significant concern to the Council. Clearly, the near, medium and long term recruitment focus of the Council must be on the younger cohort.

Finally, of major concern to the Council should be a cricket season which is not significantly and adversely impacted by weather. While weather has been a major factor in each of the last two seasons that will not continue indefinitely. Given a hot dry summer, the Council's resources will be stretched to the limit and perhaps beyond.

Issues Discussed by the Executive during the Year

The Executive discussed a number of substantive issues during the year, including:

- The roles of the members of the executive and their performance of those roles
- Umpire of the Year awards – the procedures used for determining these
- The Standing Minutes – this long saga moved towards a conclusion, with Terry Keel and Stuart Grocock taking over from the work started by Andy Turner and Bryan Climas.

- The impact of the new ACTCA Constitution upon the Council
- Pursuit of Sponsorship for the season 2012-13.

Other Council Activities

A drop in membership of the Council is evidenced elsewhere in this Annual Report, and remains an issue of concern for the Executive. Recruitment and retention of members is a key challenge into the future.

In a volunteer organisation, thanks are due to every member who made any contribution to the burden of umpiring, scoring and/or administration, along with the families, friends and others who missed out on the time and energy that was devoted to ACT cricket. The support provided by 'Manuka' - Mark Vergano and his staff at Cricket ACT - should be acknowledged, particularly the work of Chris Doyle, who is moving on to greener pastures.

As usual, the season started with the Annual Training Seminar in August, and we are once again indebted to Andrew Shelley and his, and all those they cajoled or otherwise persuaded to provide assistance.

This year's Annual Dinner was held at The Brassey in Barton, under the experienced guidance of Barry Thomas and Catherine Polglase: thanks again for their execution of a successful night. The Awards committee also deserves accolades for their completion of their arduous task.

In a season in which the ACT's various representative teams achieved significantly on the field of play, it is appropriate to offer our congratulations on their achievements to the members of the ACT State Panel (Simon Lightbody, Yohan Ramasundara, and Andrew Shelley, along with Stu Grocock and Shannon Bushell on our Emerging Umpires Panel), under the guidance of Terry Keel as the Council's High Performance Manager.

However, the Council's 'core business' remains the appointing of umpires to ACTCA matches. This onerous responsibility falls to our Appointments Panel, who had to cope not only with the expectations of a declining number of available umpires, but also the vagaries of a wet summer. It is appropriate to record our thanks to Ron Reinhard, Damian Eason and Terry Keel for all their work.

Grade Cricket Committee

The Grade Cricket Committee (GCC) is the body that runs the Grade competition, and the Council is represented on it by the Deputy Chairman (or proxies such as Ken Brazel or Bill Ruse); all of the eight clubs plus the Women's Council also have a single representative on the GCC. Decisions concerning the format of games and by-laws are decided in this forum.

Last season's prevailing good will and commonsense was again manifested this year, with a number of sensible solutions to emerging issues being reached. Many of the matters discussed at GCC are of marginal significance to umpires and scorers per se (eg the registration of players), but the Council's views are welcomed and respected by the clubs.

FINANCE OFFICER

The budget for this year was for a zero balance. This was set up by Cricket ACT without any input from me as I was in hospital recovering from an operation at that time. The final outcome was a deficit of \$1,259.50. The main factors leading to the deficit was a higher than expected number of umpires qualifying for the annual bonus and higher than budgeted purchases of merchandise, mainly umpire shirts and jackets. The deficit is partially offset by the higher value of stock held by the Equipment Officer.

The income from membership subscriptions has risen slightly from \$2,210 last season to \$2,273.

This year's seminar was held at the Canberra Grammar School. Andrew Shelley has organised a most enjoyable program. We are also very indebted to him for covering the seminar catering costs out of his own pocket.

This season's Umpires Annual Dinner was held at the Brassey of Canberra in Barton. The organising committee headed by Barry Thomas and Catherine Polglase did their usual extremely efficient job in organising this event. The overall deficit for the dinner was \$245 which was in line with expectations.

Income from the Development Levy showed an increase from \$675 in 2010/2011 to \$749. This is a pleasing outcome as last season's figure included 48 days stood in Women's CA Championships for which there was no equivalent this season. The number of standing days in Men's Grade increased from 431 to 520.

The following table shows the amounts received by umpires during last season.

In 2010-2011, umpires received \$56,786.50 for 673 umpiring days at a daily average of \$84.38.

SCORERS' REPRESENTATIVE

The 2011-12 season for the ACT Scorers Committee was again a busy time in terms of representative scoring commitments and our relationship with the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council and Cricket ACT. The scorers committee once again consisted of Judith Hall, Rob Hall and Catherine Polglase. I thank the committee for their hard work this season and especially Catherine who filled in for me at executive committee meetings and I hope to see them all back on the committee for the following season. Saying this, we were one member short on the committee again for the duration of the season and the committee is always on the lookout for interested scorer members to be part of the committee. The scorers representative, Adam Morehouse and Catherine Polglase acted as the scorer selection panel for the 2011-12 season. Also a big thank you to the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council Executive, especially Stuart Grocock, Don Harding and the rest of the executive of the ACTU&SC for all their help in the past season and to Chris Doyle, Martin Garoni and Mark Vergano at Cricket ACT for all their assistance.

The annual scorers training night, under the auspices of the NSW Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association and the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council was held in October with 17 interested people attending. Thanks go to UCSSC Lake Ginninderra for allowing the committee to use the venue. On the same evening, three scorer members attempted the very hard NSWCUA advanced scorers exam with Darren Mattison having the good fortune of passing the exam. My thanks go to Darren Goodger, Development Manager of the NSWCUA and Marilyn Fowler, chairperson of the NSW Scorer's Committee, for their continued support in running this annual training evening.

The representative commitment for scorers this season was not as heavy as in past seasons but it was still a credit to those scorers who put their names forward to score representative matches this season. In addition to ACT Meteors and ACT Comets matches, scorers were required for the Prime Minister's XI, two CA Chairman's XI tour matches against India and two matches between an ACT Invitational XI against the New South Wales 2nd XI. For the first time in many seasons, there was not a national carnival held in Canberra for which scorers could be appointed to. This was disappointing as it has proved a very good proving ground for scorers to gain experience to take to the next level of scoring. I would like to congratulate Darren Mattison who was invited to score at the Imparja Cup in Alice Springs in February. It was splendid to see the hard work that Darren has put in over many seasons rewarded by this honour.

Liam Baker, Judith Hall, Jeremy Marples, Darren Mattison, Andrew Moyes, Maria Picker and Catherine Polglase were appointed to Women's National Cricket League and WNCL Twenty20 matches. Liam Baker, Judith Hall, and Darren Mattison were appointed to Futures League matches. Catherine Polglase and Darren Mattison were selected to score the Prime Minister's XI match against Sri Lanka in February but unfortunately the match was abandoned without a ball being bowled due to rain.

I would like to thank all scorer members who took time from their lives to score representative, grade and school cricket during the 2011-12 season. A number of people scored for the first time at grade and school level and I hope some of those and those who attended the scorer's training night will put their hand up to score at representative level in the future. The next few years will be a challenge for the scorers committee. The committee has been a stable unit for the past few seasons but it may be time for some new blood on the committee. It would be nice for some scorer members to put their hand up to join the committee in the next season or future seasons.

HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER

Season 2011-12 was my second year in the role of Umpire's High Performance Manager (HPM), and it again proved a challenging one. My vision for the role continues to be that the HPM should be someone who can help with the overall development of all of our umpires, and in particular our best-performing umpires - hopefully well enough to help them to progress further along the Cricket Australia (CA) Pathway.

This year's High Performance Panel - a small group of our best up and coming umpires, as selected by the Appointments Manager and myself - performed very well on the field and showed dedication and commitment to the cause off the field as well. Our Panel this year combined a reasonable blend of youth and experience. It comprised experienced and dependable umpires in Simon Lightbody, Andrew Shelley and Yohan Ramasundara, supported by up-and-comers who are considered to have loads of potential, in Shannon Bushell, Stuart Grocock and Tom Logan.

In deciding on the composition of the Panel, we also had an eye to CA's template of representative umpires. CA places great store in fostering for their programmes, umpires with a high level of natural ability as decision-makers, as well as appropriate fitness and flexibility in keeping with the modern image of a representative cricket umpire; gone are the days of the big, overweight, immobile cricket umpire, at least in televised CA matches it

seems! CA is also mindful that umpires, who are going to form part of the CA Pathway, need to be young enough to allow for them to progress along the Pathway at an expected rate, such that they would not be considered too old by the time they reach the end of the Pathway.

All our Panel members got the opportunity to stand in representative matches, and without exception, they all acquitted themselves admirably, and represented our Council with distinction. Congratulations in particular to Simon Lightbody for being appointed to his first on-field Prime Minister's XI match. It was very well-deserved, and although the weather was less than kind, I feel sure that the experience will stand him in good stead. Simon also was honoured later in the season by being one of only four umpires on CA's "radar" who were invited to officiate in CA's prestigious four-nations under age tournament in Townsville, where I understand that he acquitted himself well.

Simon Lightbody and Shannon Bushell represented our Council capably at this season's Under 19 and Under 17 Championships, respectively. The reports received from UHPP observers generally reflected the good performances of our Panel members, although there were some areas identified for improvement.

This season, I decided to refine the Panel's development/training programme, in response to the feedback I received from members of last season's Panel. With that feedback in mind, the programme was re-gearred so that it was a little more laid-back, and perhaps better tailored to the fitness and knowledge requirements of representative umpires. The programme saw the Panel meet each Thursday after work for a 45 minute walk around the lake. Nothing too taxing, but by the same token, it helped clear the cobwebs out of participants' heads. It was also a good opportunity to build camaraderie and our knowledge by discussing situations and decisions made in matches we had been involved in over the past week. As with all the Panel's training activities, it was open to all Council members to join us, but sadly, few chose to.

The programme also gave Panel members the opportunity of attending presentations by various people from the wider sporting community, including a Sports Psychologist, and an evening at Goulburn where the group was able to benefit from listening to the experiences and views of Darren Goodger (newly-appointed State Director of Umpiring in NSW, replacing Darryl Hair). Darren's interactive session was very well received by all who attended, as he was able to draw on his First-Class and extensive Grade cricket experience to give attendees valuable insight into the challenges confronting representative umpires.

I was able to arrange for some of our Panel members to stand during the season in Sydney Grade matches. While this placed a strain on our local umpiring availability resources, this proved to be a very beneficial development opportunity for the umpires concerned, as they were able to experience umpiring high-standard matches in a foreign environment, applying unfamiliar playing conditions.

After the completion of the season, there was a meeting of all the States and Territories' State Directors of Umpiring (SDU), hosted in Melbourne by Cricket Australia. Due to a prior engagement, I was unfortunately unable to attend, however Yohan Ramasundara kindly stood in for me. The SDU meeting discussed a range of issues impacting on the way in which emerging and First-Class umpires are managed and general umpire recruitment strategies. This was an opportunity for the SDU's to share with their counterparts the issues affecting them.

FUTURES LEAGUE T/20, MALE UNDER 19 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS & U19 WORLD CUP QUAD SERIES

FUTURES LEAGUE T/20 - MELBOURNE - DECEMBER 2011

The week in Melbourne for this tournament kicked off with an afternoon session lead by Sean Cary, Simon Taufel and Daryl Harper. A large component on the session was discussing the book, which we were required to read, "The monk who sold his Ferrari". The book had nothing to do with cricket 'per se' but was rather about life and how one views it and what one can do to improve on things.

We also viewed some video of games involving Daryl as third umpire and some controversial decisions he made. Simon spoke to us about the motivational and mind set side of umpiring. Unlike in previous tournaments there was no "final" played, it was simply a round robin event.

Unfortunately there was a bit of rain around in Melbourne that week, which whilst not good for cricket, was good in ensuring one knew calculations for time lost due to weather. Various grounds around Melbourne were used with some grounds affected by water to such a degree that no play was possible. Ground staff at other locations did a great job to ensure games were able to be transferred to other venues where possible.

UNDER 19 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS – ADELAIDE - JANUARY 2012

Unlike last year's competition which was impacted by rain, this years was completely rain free and no playing time was lost on any day that was caused by weather. The standard of competition was once again very high with a couple of players already having played Shield cricket. Queensland were the eventual winners of the completion with a good number of players from Queensland who were ultimately selected for the U19 World Cup team that would be played in August later that year.

During one of the rest days we had a day session at the Adelaide Oval led by Denis Burns from Cricket Australia. ICC Test umpire Simon Taufel attended as did National Panel umpires Paul Wilson, and Simon Fry. The "classroom" session involved pre championship routine...that is...how do and what do you do to prepare yourself before going away to a tournament. Simon Taufel spoke about and made mention of the little things to be aware of as you progress further up the ladder.

We then all ventured onto the Adelaide Oval and had some informal talks with Simon on any cricket related matter we wanted to discuss.

U19 WORLD CUP QUAD SERIES – TOWNSVILLE - APRIL 2012

This series between teams from Australia, New Zealand, India and England was a warm up series to the official world cup to be played in Brisbane, Sunshine Coast and Townsville in August 2012. It was played under one day international playing conditions and as a round robin even between all 4 teams. Tony Ireland Stadium and Endeavour Park were the two venues used throughout the 2 weeks.

Being judged as the best U19 players from their respective countries you can imagine that the standard and quality of play was extremely high. Some of the players from Australia and New Zealand had already played First Class cricket, some from England had played County Cricket and some from India had played in the IPL.

All the teams had a great deal of support staff with high tech video analysis also used. Bob Stratford and Denis Burns were the Cricket Australia High Performance observers. Post-match meetings were held after each game with captains and umpires all participating.

In the game I did between England and India, there was a potential racial incident where the Indian fielders were in "discussion" with an England batsman of Indian extraction. The "discussion" was heated and in Hindi and thus neither myself nor my partner was aware of what was being said. We did speak with the Indian captain on field and then the matter was raised by the England team in the post-match meeting.

In the interest of space I have kept these reports brief and each could be extensively expanded. Should any member be interested in hearing anything else I would be happy to discuss.

MALE UNDER 17 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

I had the honour of representing the ACT Cricket Umpires and Scorer's Association at the 2011/2012 U17 National Championships held during December 2011 in Hobart. I would like to thank the selection committee for selecting me. Immediately I felt that I had a big job to do given the high standard of umpires provided by the ACT to this tournament previously. Notwithstanding this slight feeling of pressure it turned out to be one of the best learning experiences in my life; not just cricket. I could write about the tournament from the perspective of weather, team strength and who won and who the good players were and so on, however I thought I should write this column on the key 'takeaways' for me personally and share those thoughts with the readers so they can reflect on them as well in relation to their own umpiring.

I touched down at Hobart airport, collected my luggage and began looking for my fellow NSW umpire, Ben Nicholls, with whom I was to travel to our tournament hotel. As I searched for Ben at the airport it immediately dawned upon me that the umpires were being tested for teamwork and personal interaction traits as soon as we got off the aircraft. My initial observation was reaffirmed constantly throughout the entire two-week tournament. I would have to say that the number one trait sought by Cricket Australia observers was the ability to communicate and interact. Of course knowledge of the laws, application of the correct playing conditions and making correct on-field decisions were all very important, but these capabilities were not useful if you couldn't communicate them effectively.

The theme of teamwork between umpiring colleagues was reinforced constantly. As the tournament progressed I began to understand why. Any hint of fractious interaction or even a minute perception of disagreement between umpires would be ruthlessly exploited by captains, players and team officials and would stick out like a 'sore thumb' to any observer. I kept remembering Bob Hawke's political comments of the 1980s that "disunity is death". Fortunately all of the umpires that I stood with were of a similar mindset and in the main we all enjoyed good quality communication, interspersed with humour, which rounded out what was a very professional approach to our umpiring.

The extra pressure applied in a tournament context was certainly a new experience for me, which can bring out the best, or worst, in people. It became apparent that there are many 'good' umpires that could be selected by the respective State High Performance Managers to attend such tournaments, as they know the laws, can apply playing conditions and make generally good decisions. What the tournament and observation process does is add real pressure and real scrutiny into the equation and you are measured on your management of these stresses. The difference between a 'good' umpire and 'elite' umpire is exposed.

For some individuals the temptation to put themselves first and to put their own career aspirations ahead of everything else proves to be too great. If you succumb to this temptation it will affect your behaviour and how you deal with people and situations. Your integrity will be compromised. This behaviour is observable and is not what will make you an elite official. You are observed on your ability to deal with the additional stresses provided by the tournament and maintain professional and effective communication with all 'stakeholders', which includes captains, players, team officials, Cricket Australia officials, ground authorities, facilities managers, scorers, umpire observers and of course fellow umpires. I can quote the following from one of the seminar sessions for the benefit of all readers: "To be a good umpire you need to be a good person, and to be a successful umpire you need to be a successful person."

On a personal level, I will never forget meeting legends of cricket, such as Greg Chappell, Ray Bright, Ric Evans, Bob Stratford, Simon Taufel and Daryl Harper. I learnt more off the

field from these characters than I did on it, and that is saying a lot because I certainly learnt a lot on the field.

IMPARJA CUP

During February 2012, I had the honour of representing ACT at the Imparja Cup at Alice Springs.

The Imparja Cup is a carnival which show-pieces Australia's best men and women Indigenous cricketers. Three grounds were used for the Men's Imparja Cup being Traeger, Larapinta and Albrecht.

Umpires are rotated so that one gets to umpire every State/Territory and umpire with every other umpire. ACT representative Aaron Briscoe was elected to the ICAC (Development Board) which reports to Cricket Australia Board.
