## CHAIRMAN

The 2012–2013 season was again a challenging one for the Council as we endeavoured to meet our goals. Our numbers are such that it is always a challenge to meet the requirements of umpiring in the Grade Competitions, as well as meeting the disparate requests that come our way from other bodies.

In what has been a particularly busy season, I am grateful for the willingness of members to make themselves available on a regular basis. I also appreciate the efforts of the Appointments Panel to make appointments consistent with the priorities of Cricket ACT and the principles of appointment established by the Council.

Whilst our endeavours to increase our number of active umpires are a never-ending battle, it was pleasing to see the recruitment of several new umpires, some with significant experience interstate, this season. All have displayed a strong commitment to standing regularly and developing their knowledge and skills.

It was difficult to identify sufficient experienced umpires to stand in the three-day semi-finals in First and Second Grades, as, for a variety of reasons; many of our more experienced umpires were unavailable on the Friday. However, with the assistance of ACT Cricket staff, in one game one Council Umpire was appointed, with a different "independent umpire" standing at square leg on each of the three days. Whilst less than ideal, it was an example of the cooperative spirit existing between the two bodies!

Fortunately, scorer numbers were up and representative commitments were fulfilled without any fuss. Long standing (or sitting?) scorers, Robert and Judith Hall have moved to Newcastle and, having made a significant contribution to the Scorers' committee over the years, we extend our thanks and best wishes to them. I understand they have already found a cricket club with which to further their scoring.

The introduction of lights to Manuka Oval was a great initiative, and one which bodes well for promotion of cricket in the ACT and the region. Stuart Grocock successfully took a step up in his umpiring career, standing in the Prime Minister's XI v West Indies match, the first played at Manuka Oval under lights, with the Cricket Australia National Panel member Tony Ward. The One Day International was a great success and should be the harbinger of things to follow.

Shannon Bushell also took a step forward in his career, being appointed to his first Futures League match, and Melissa Jones debuted in an interstate Women's Twenty20 match. It is pleasing to see the progression of our umpires to higher levels, particularly as all received favourable reports from Cricket Australia.

The Council appreciates the ongoing cooperative approach Cricket ACT applies to its relationship with the Council. Ben Ryan took on an expanded role as Grade and Junior Cricket Administrator (a workload I do not envy) and has provided the Council with much support and assistance. I feel particular commendation should be accorded to Martin Garoni as he continues to support the Council and its goals across many facets of ACT Cricket. Whilst I have singled out those with whom we have the most frequent dealings, all of the staff of ACT Cricket generally has been most helpful.

The Council's Awards for the 2012–2013 season were as follows:

- First Grade umpire of the year - Kevin McCarty Medal - Andrew Shelley
- Best Second Grade umpire – Brian Lawrence Medal – Andrew Kopras
- Best other grades umpire – Derek Gould Memorial Medal – Bryan Climas
- Founders' Award – Graeme Clifton (an award made by the Chairman for service "over and above" (named in recognition of the three founding members, namely Charles Morrison, Austin Selleck, and 'Ned' Custance).

Cricket Australia has formally recognised 50 years of service to Australian Cricket, and Leo Wyche and Greg Rouse are worthy recipients of this award.

As is often the case, the joys of a generally successful season are marred by the sad news of the passing of a former Umpire. Geoff Bennett, Life Member, Secretary and then President for altogether nearly 20 years, and one who stood in several senior representative matches, passed away in late April. Whilst not known to most of the current standing umpires, he will still be sadly missed by many in the wider cricket community.

Of note also is the success enjoyed by Simon Lightbody, a Council member, who is now furthering his umpiring in Sydney and who has stood in various representative matches, including a warm-up tournament for the Under 19 World Cup which was held in Australia this season.

As the Executive Committee's and other office bearers' reports that follows describes many of the season's activities and issues, I will avoid repetition.

I have had a number of discussions with Mark Vergano on the vexed issue of obtaining sponsorship. Whilst there have been a couple of "near misses", such support continues to elude us; unfortunately.

Cricket Australia has incorporated Indoor Cricket into its organisation and this is filtering down to the States and Territories. I had an introductory meeting with the ATCA staff responsible for Indoor Cricket. At this stage the Council is not required to become involved, though in the next year or so we may have a small part to play in assisting with training. Training will likely remain their responsibility for the foreseeable future, due to the significant differences between indoor and outdoor cricket.

In closing I would like to express my sincere thanks to members of the Executive, other office bearers, and all umpires, for the support given to me in my first season in the Chair

## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

The Council's Executive consists of its Chair, Deputy Chair, Finance Representative, Secretary, Scorers' Representative and (Umpire) High Performance Manager: the HPM is the representative of the ACTCA Board on the Executive. At times during the season, other Council office holders (Manager Appointments, Manager Recruitment & Training, General Liaison Officer and other members) were invited to attend meetings of the Executive Committee when relevant matters were to be discussed. While there was a standing invitation to any Council member to attend as an observer, no member took this offer up.

The Committee convened on ten occasions during 2012-13. Meetings were usually held on the second Wednesday of the month at the Italo-Australian Club. Agenda for, and minutes of, the meetings were meant to be routinely posted on the Council's web site ([www.actumpires.com](http://www.actumpires.com)) as a way of facilitating the accountability of elected office holders, as well as keeping members informed about the issues being considered by the Executive. During the year, this did not work as well as intended and greater efforts must be made next year to improve on this key governance indicator. The assistance of our Web Master, Chris Cahill, is integral in this process.

While not all office holders were able to attend all meetings during the year (Table 1 below), the overall attendance record was extremely high.

The Executive welcomed three new members after the 2012 AGM, with Bill Ruse taking over the role of Chairman from Ken Brazel, Peter McCann taking over the role of Secretary from

Don Harding and David Markham taking on the vacant role of General Liaison Office. Dave Markham also took on the role of Equipment Officer.

Adam Morehouse's personal circumstances meant that he found attendance at Executive meetings quite difficult for him and Catherine Polglase kindly agreed to continue to act as a standing proxy for Adam at these meetings.

# Executive Meetings were not held in May and June 2013

### General Meetings

Including the Annual Seminar, seven General Meetings and one Special Meeting of the Council were held between September 2012 and April 2013. General Meetings were generally held on the third Monday of each month. In line with past practice, the December General Meeting morphed into a very well attended Christmas social function at Black Mountain Peninsula. There was no meeting of members in March so as to facilitate attendance by them at the Council's Annual Dinner and Awards evening.

The effort to focus the agenda of these meetings on real match day situations, field-craft, 'practical umpiring', including Laws/rules and umpiring-related developments within CA and the ACTCA was again continued. Some meetings were extremely interesting for those attending.

Nevertheless, while only a combined total of 184 members attended these eight meetings; giving rise to a mean attendance of 23.0 members, this reflected a marked improvement of member participation in the business of the Council since 2010-11.

### Membership

Membership of the Council remained about the same as last year and the Council was fortunate indeed in that it was able to recruit, train and regularly appoint to games a number of new and younger members.



In its last two Annual Reports, the Council highlighted the fact that it is heavily reliant on the regular availability of about 20 members (or about half of the total number of standing umpires). Over the course of last season, nothing much has changed although it could be argued that things have improved. While the table below is self explanatory, it is worthy of further comment.

This historical table reflects that 20 members stood on a minimum of 22.4 days during 2012-13. Those numbers are ahead of the trend since 2001-02. In addition, some other 9 members stood on a minimum of 20 days during the season. Taking that into account 2012-13, compared to the previous seasons, reflected a much greater propensity of active members to share the umpiring workload, offset by the fact that a small number of members stood very infrequently.

Overall, this year reflected a very good participation outcome for the Council. And, it needed to because the weather was kind to ACT cricket during the season with very few games being cancelled or abandoned because of wet weather. Even then, our active member numbers made it impossible for the Council to be able to appoint to all games played. See the associated report from the Manager, Appointments.

By way of comparison;

#### **2010-11**

44 per cent of active members accounted for 75 per cent of days stood (16 members accounted for 509 days, with a mean of nearly 32 days per 'core member').

#### **2011-12**

50 per cent of active members accounted for 77 per cent of days stood (19 members accounted for 575 days with a mean of 30 days per 'core member').

#### **2012-13**

50 per cent of active members accounted for 71 per cent of days stood (19 members accounted for 592 days with a mean of 31 days per 'core member'. Nine other members accounted for 176 days with a mean of 20 days per core member.

In its Annual Report last year, the Council made the observation that the age profile of the current membership is, or should be, of significant concern. Pleasingly, the cohort of members recruited this season is young and that bodes well for the Council. At the same time, the now, medium and long term recruitment focus of the Council must remain on garnering and retaining younger members.

### **Issues Discussed by the Executive during the Year**

The Executive discussed a number of substantive issues during the year, including:

- Life Membership and Membership of the Council.
- Umpire of the Year awards – the procedures used for determining these.
- The Standing Minutes – further refinement of this important document, noting the good work injected into this process by Terry Keel and Bryan Climas.
- A 'tidy-up' of ACTCA Competition Rules for 2013-14
- Council equipment for 2013-14
- Inter-connectivity and working relationships between ACTCA and the Council.

### **Other Council Activities**

While membership of the Council has remained about the same as last season, as is evidenced elsewhere in this Annual Report, recruitment and retention of younger members is a key challenge into the future and remains an ongoing issue of concern for the Executive.

In a volunteer organisation, thanks are due to every member who made any contribution to the burden of umpiring, scoring and/or administration, along with the families, friends and others who missed out on the time and energy that they devoted to ACT cricket. The support provided by 'Manuka' - Mark Vergano and his staff at Cricket ACT – should be acknowledged, particularly the work of Martin Garoni.

As usual, the season started with the Annual Training Seminar in August, and we are once again indebted to Andrew Shelley and all those that he and his panel cajoled or otherwise persuaded to provide assistance on the day. Member feedback suggests that this Seminar was a highly successful one.

This year's Annual Dinner and Awards Night was again held at 'The Brassey' in Barton, put together and orchestrated by the experienced organisation team comprised of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Mark Ferris. Many thanks again for their marvellous contributions towards what was an enjoyable and successful night. The Awards Committee also deserves accolades for the professional and transparent way in which they performed their thankless task this year. Well done.

In a season in which the ACT's various representative teams achieved significantly on the field of play, it is appropriate to offer our congratulations on their achievements to the members of the ACT Elite Umpires Panel (Yohan Ramasundara, Andrew Shelley and Stu Grocock), along with Mark Ferris, Shannon Bushell and Melissa Jones; our Emerging Umpires Panel members, under the expert guidance of Terry Keel in his key role of the Council's High Performance Manager.

However, as ever, the Council's 'core business' remains the appointment of umpires to ACTCA graded matches every Saturday, a number of Sundays and often mid week games. Umpire appointments is an outcome which takes into account games which need to be appointed to, relative standard of those games, umpire availability, demonstrated umpire ability, mentoring of new umpires, appointment equity and a number of other often subtle issues which need to be considered. This is not an easy task.

This important and vital responsibility falls to our Appointments Panel, chaired this year by Ron Reinhard, It is appropriate to record our thanks to Ron and his panel members; Bryan Climas, Alan Jordan, Nick Ewbank and Terry Keel; for their very good work during the season.

### **Grade Cricket Committee**

The Grade Cricket Committee (GCC) is the body which runs the various ACTCA competitions, and the Council is represented on it by the Deputy Chairman or proxies such as Bill Ruse. All of the eight clubs plus the Women's Council also have a single representative on the GCC. Decisions concerning the format of games playing conditions and by-laws are decided in this forum.

Last season's prevailing good will and commonsense was again manifested this year, with a number of sensible solutions to emerging issues being reached. Many of the matters discussed at GCC are of marginal significance to umpires and scorers per se (eg the registration of players), but the Council's views are always welcomed and respected by the GCC and the respective clubs.

## FINANCE OFFICER

### FINANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

The budget for this year was for a zero balance. This was set up by Cricket ACT by simply re-using the 2011-12 budget, totally ignoring a proposed budget which I submitted to them. The final outcome was a deficit of \$1,168.02. The main factor leading to the deficit was below budget income (\$518) from merchandise sales. The budgeted amount in this cost centre (\$3,600) was not achievable, as we did not even have stock in hand to cover such an amount. Another factor was a late payment (\$428) for Tom Smith books supplied to us in 2011-12 by Cricket Australia.

The income from membership subscriptions has risen from \$2,273 last season to \$2,814.

This year's seminar was again held at the Canberra Grammar School. Andrew Shelley did an outstanding job in organising this event. Once again, he covered the seminar catering costs out of his own pocket, which has decreased our deficit level and for which we are extremely grateful.

This season's Umpires Annual Dinner was held at the 'Brassey' of Canberra in Barton. The organising committee comprising of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Mark Ferris did a wonderful job in organising this event. The overall deficit for the dinner was \$249 which was in line with expectations.

Income from the Development Levy showed an increase from \$749 in 2011/2012 to \$829. This is a pleasing outcome as last season's figure included 34 days stood in Women's Premier League for which there was no equivalent this season. The change is due mainly to the increased number of standing days in Men's T20 matches (from 50 to 102) and the increased number of standing days in Men's Grade (from 520 to 582).

The following table reflects the amounts received by umpires as expenses during last season.

(a) Total of this column differs from the amount collected in the development levy (\$829) as there were 15 appointments made to non ACTCA matches for which the development levy was deducted, but for which expenses were paid directly to umpires by match organisers.

In 2011-2012, umpires received \$66,329.00 for 749 umpiring days at a daily average of \$88.68.

Finally, the Umpire Bonus system was again operating this season. Eleven members received \$200.00 each for a total bonus outlay of \$2,200.00

## **SCORERS' REPRESENTATIVE**

The 2012-13 season was a busy season once again for the ACT Scorers Committee in terms of representative scoring commitments and our relationship with the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council and Cricket ACT. The scorers committee once again consisted of Judith Hall, Rob Hall and Catherine Polglase. I thank the committee for its hard work this season and especially Catherine who filled in for me at executive committee meetings due to work and family commitments.

I would like to take the time to also thank Judith and Robert Hall for their time on the committee since its inception. Jude and Rob have decided to move to warmer climes and to be closer to family and on behalf of the committee and myself I would like to thank them for their time effort that they have put into the committee in the past five odd years. Jude was instrumental with myself in starting up the scorers committee on that cold bleak day in Bowral and in guiding the committee into the structure which is now the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council.

Jude scored at a representative level for many years, including two Prime Minister's XI matches and numerous Cricket Australia Cup and Women's National League matches. Rob always provided the committee with wise counsel and I always looked to him for advice which he always happily provided.

The scorers' representative, Adam Morehouse and Catherine Polglase acted as the scorer selection panel for the 2012-13 season. Also a big thank you to the ACT Umpires & Scorers Council Executive, especially Bill Ruse, Peter McCann and the rest of the executive of the ACTU&SC for all their help in the past season and to Ben Ryan, Martin Garoni and Mark Vergano at Cricket ACT for all their assistance.

The representative commitment for scorers this season was not as heavy as in past seasons but it was still a credit to those scorers who put their names forward to score representative matches this season. In addition to ACT Meteors and ACT Comets matches, scorers were required for the One Day International, the Prime Minister's XI match, a CA Chairman's XI tour match against Sri Lanka and two matches between and a Territories XI against a SACA XI.

I would like to congratulate Darren Mattison who has made the jump and was selected to score NSW representative matches in the form of WNCL matches at Blacktown. He was also a late replacement for the Ryobi One-Day Cup match between New South Wales and Queensland and scored again at the Imparja Cup in Alice Springs in February 2013.

Liam Baker, Judith Hall, Jeremy Marples, Darren Mattison, Adam Morehouse, Maria Picker, Catherine Polglase and Anne Sutherland were appointed to Women's National Cricket League and WNCL Twenty20 matches. Liam Baker, Darren Mattison and Catherine Polglase were appointed to Futures League matches. Catherine Polglase and Darren Mattison were again selected to score the Prime Minister's XI match against the West Indies in the first day/night match played at Manuka Oval. They were also appointed to the first One Day International played by Australia at Manuka Oval.

I would like to thank all scorer members who took time from their lives to score representative, grade and school cricket during the 2012-13 season. A number of people scored for the first time this season at grade and school level. The next few years will be a challenge for the scorers committee. The committee has been a stable unit for the past few seasons but it is time for some new blood on the committee with the retirement of Jude and Rob. It would be nice for some scorer members to put their hand up to join the committee in the next season or future seasons.

## HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER

As ACT Cricket Umpires' High Performance Manager my role is to oversee the training and development of our Council members who are being considered for representative appointments. Jointly with the Chair of the Appointments Panel, it is my responsibility to appoint umpires who I think will best serve the Council in various representative and high-profile matches during the season.

Season 2013-13 was a busy one in terms of representative appointments for the Council's leading umpires. We were asked to appoint umpires to two Cricket Australia Futures League matches (Comets' home games), several Women's National Cricket League 50-over and T20 matches and, of course, the Council provided an umpire at one end of the Prime Minister's XI match. These high-profile appointments were fulfilled admirably by the following members of the High Performance Representative Panel:

- Yohan Ramasundara and Andrew Shelley – ACT Comets v QLD Futures League at Manuka
- Yohan Ramasundara and Shannon Bushell – ACT Comets v NSW Futures League at Freebody
- Shannon Bushell , Mark Ferris , Stuart Grocock, Melissa Jones , Yohan Ramsundara and Andrew Shelley – various WNCL 50-over and T20 matches involving the Meteors at Manuka and Freebody
- Stuart Grocock (on-field umpire) – PM's XI v West Indies at Manuka
- Mark Ferris (4<sup>th</sup> Umpire) – PM's XI v West Indies at Manuka
- Mark Ferris – represented the ACT at the Cricket Australia Under 17s Men's Championships in Hobart
- Yohan Ramasundara (4<sup>th</sup> Umpire) – Ryobi Cup, NSW v QLD at Manuka
- Stuart Grocock (4<sup>th</sup> Umpire) – Sheffield Shield, NSW v QLD at Manuka

All these umpires performed admirably in their various capacities and represented the Council with distinction. This was evidenced by the generally positive feedback received from the captains in these games, and the Cricket Australia UHPP observers at those matches. Congratulations to all of these umpires, but in particular to Stuart Grocock, for his debut appointment to the PM's XI fixture; also to Shannon Bushell (debut as a Futures League match umpire); and to Melissa Jones, who made her debut as an umpire at the representative level.

A special mention also goes to Peter McCann, who represented the Council at the Imparja Cup Tournament in Alice Springs. By all reports Peter had a successful tournament and acquitted himself well.

Special thanks also to Andy Turner, who agreed to help me out by accepting the responsibility as the official UHPP Observer in several WNCL 50-over and T20 matches during the season. Between the two of us, Andy and I observed 9 such matches, and while being Observer is not a patch on actually standing out in the middle and umpiring (it's a bit like kissing one's sister!), we managed to muddle through for the most part.

There were several training and development opportunities for the Representative Panel umpires during the season, and the group met weekly during the season for some elementary physical fitness sessions. While sometimes poorly patronised, these sessions proved useful as a forum for discussion about events and incidents which had arisen during

recent matches, and as such they were also a useful training and development tool (not to mention a good means of bonding and camaraderie amongst the group.

In conclusion I would like to note that the Umpires' Council is fortunate to be blessed with a solid blend of youth and experience among its representative umpires. In appointing these umpires to high-profile matches, it has been my intention this season to blood where I can a broad range of younger, less experienced umpires, for the purpose of building depth to our list; this is also useful as a forward planning tool. I think that we have several more umpires amongst our ranks, who haven't had the opportunity yet to display their talents on the Representative stage, but who I feel confident have the potential to do well at this level. If I continue in this role next season, I intend to provide these untested umpires with an opportunity.

## **Appointments Manager**

I would like to thank the members of the appointments panel (Bryan Climas, Alan Jordon, Nick Ewbank and Terry Keel for their assistance and insightful comments during the weekly appointments meetings.

During the 2012/13 Cricket Season the council appointed umpires to a 354 of a total of 467 ACTCA sponsored or participated games – which comprised:

We were generally able to fill all requests for umpires on a regular basis except for 3<sup>rd</sup> thru 5<sup>th</sup> grade Men's Saturday games. It should be noted that a total of 73 games included in the above analysis involved the appointment of a single umpire; which was comprised of:

- 0 1<sup>st</sup> Grade
- 12 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade (includes 1 Semi-final in the 2 day competition –played as a 3 day game)
- 8 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade
- 11 4<sup>th</sup> Grade
- 14 5<sup>th</sup> Grade
- 0 Division 1 T20
- 2 Division 2 T20
- 5 Division 3 T20
- 7 Division 4 T20
- 10 Women's fixtures
- 4 Junior Representative fixtures

Of particular concern was our inability this season to identify sufficient experienced umpires to stand in the 3 day semi-finals in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grades. This resulted in one game having one umpire appointed and three different "independent umpires" standing at square leg on each of the 3 days. This situation occurred because many of our more experienced umpires are unable or unwilling to take leave from work for a 3 day game (Friday, Saturday and Sunday). In some cases this may reportedly be more pronounced if the game is not a 1<sup>st</sup> grade semi-final or final.

## UNDER 17 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

In December 2012, I had the honour of representing the Council at the National U17 Championships in Hobart. It was a homecoming of sorts for me, having begun my umpiring journey in Hobart during the 2007/08 season, and it was of great value to reconnect with many of my old Tasmanian umpiring colleagues and see how their umpiring group has developed over the past few years.

Of even greater interest was the opportunity to meet, and umpire with, umpires from each of the other States and Territories represented at the Championships. We quickly learned that nothing could be taken for granted regarding what was a "normal" routine, signal or pre-game preparation; each of us had slightly varying approaches, borne of different coaching perspectives prevalent in our umpiring associations. For example, one umpire would always signal when there were three balls to go in the over, as well as two; another umpire would rigorously stick to a strategy of meeting his partner for a quick chat at least once every hour as well as during drinks breaks, even more if he felt his or his partner's concentration was flagging; while yet another umpire was enthusiastic about walking around the boundary before each day's play. There were occasional negative examples of differences in approaches too, of course, but these only served to underline the fact that we all learned and improved as a direct result of close-up exposure to other representative umpires' approaches to officiating. It is worth noting that despite any variance in routine between umpires, there is always a recognisable logic behind specific techniques.

This learning didn't just occur on-field. The eight of us spent a great deal of time together off-field, both socially and in CA-run professional development sessions. During the formal sessions much of that time was devoted to video feedback and analysis, where we all discovered that the CA cameras don't miss much once the umpires leave the relative safety of the change-rooms! Discussions also centred on goal setting and the concept of team preparation, with examples given of how ICC match officials prepare as a team for series and tournaments – challenging all of our beliefs regarding just when teamwork should begin for us as umpires. After this tournament, we were all left in no doubt that success as umpires depends on teamwork from the moment one is informed of one's appointments.

Teamwork was a concept very much reinforced by Test umpires Tony Hill and Nigel Llong, who stayed in the same hotel as our umpiring group during the concurrent Australia v Sri Lanka Test match. We were lucky enough to spend considerable time with Tony and Nigel discussing all things umpiring, both in a formal setting and at breakfast on several mornings. Regrettably, some of us had cause to question our pre-match preparations when comparing our own egg, bacon and hash brown-laden plates with Aleem Dar's consistent breakfast diet of fruit, yoghurt and cereal!

For those members who may harbour thoughts of taking their first steps on the CA representative umpiring pathway, you will find it pleasing to know that CA generally are very accepting of different umpiring approaches and backgrounds. What is essential is that you must display some ability to learn and improve after mistakes, and demonstrate 'coachability' (a CA term!) – an inclination to listen to different umpiring ideas and suggestions, making modifications to one's approach where necessary.

For those of you interested in such things, the unbeaten Victorian team finished the Championships as deserved winners, mainly due to their deployment of a fearsome battery of fast bowlers. The ACT was awarded the Spirit of Cricket award, with Mark Solway receiving praise for his mature captaincy throughout the tournament. Internationals Ed Cowan and Tim Paine spoke of the qualities necessary to move to 'the next level', while Greg

Chappell, Tim Nielsen and Troy Cooley looked on in their capacity as coaches and talent scouts.

In closing, I would like to extend a very sincere thank you to Terry Keel and the appointments committee for putting my name forward for selection in these Championships. I hope to complete my experience of umpiring in a CA pathway tournament environment by sharing freely some of my now-refined routines and match-management strategies with whomever I stand with over the coming seasons – until I do that, I won't have made the most of the many opportunities for improvement that I have been presented with at this tournament.

## **IMPARJA CUP**

From 17-24 February 2013, I had the honour of representing the ACT at the Imparja Cup; an indigenous cricket carnival held annually at Alice Springs. This year, some 500 players, support staff and administrators from many parts of Australia gathered at the 'Alice' for 6 days of exciting cricket.

The structure of this year's Imparja Cup catered for 38 teams across a range of competitions. The elite men's and women's State and Territory competitions were underpinned by the hugely popular major centres (Darwin, Alice Springs, Tennent Creek, etc) and community (Timber Creek, Amoonguna, Tiwi Islands, etc) competitions. While all games were played under round robin formats, the elite men's and women's and major centres competitions were also played under the Big Bash League T20 rules whereas the community competitions were played under 'pooled' Super 8 rules.

While I had been told that the standard of the men's State and Territory competition was around that of ACT 1<sup>st</sup> Grade, I was somewhat sceptical about that advice. However, I was pleasantly surprised to find that in most of the games that I either stood in or observed, that was indeed the standard of cricket played at Alice Springs this year. The very low number of leg-side wides called during the games which I stood in was nothing short of astonishing given the very high quality fast and slow bowling on display.

New South Wales, Queensland, Victoria and Western Australia fielded very strong teams. In the case of NSW, it boasted a number of 1<sup>st</sup> Grade players from the Sydney competition; players like Jeff Cook (Western Suburbs), Andrew Gordon (Western Suburbs), Jake Turner (Easts) and Nathan Price (Randwick) to name some as well as some top line players from the country; players like Pat Rosser who plays his cricket around Tamworth.

Appointments to games were shared equitably among the eight elite panel umpires and my schedule of games stood is set out in the following table. Wednesday was a general lay-day, but my night game on Wednesday meant that I did not have to stand in two games on the Thursday, as was the case on the Monday and Tuesday. That really was a bonus for me. All elite panel umpires stood in one night game.

# This game was played under lights at Traeger Park; a first class facility which would be the envy of any Australian State or Territory Cricket Association.

My games on Thursday and Friday were fiercely contested affairs because, on the Thursday, Queensland had to win (well) to stay alive in the competition. Similarly, on the Friday, Western Australia had to win (well) to proceed to the Grand Final on the Saturday.

Umpires from Victoria and the Northern Territory were appointed to the men's Grand Final on the Saturday.

In the event, Queensland resoundingly, and quite unexpectedly, defeated New South Wales in the men's Grand Final with New South Wales coming out on top over the Invitational Team (Captained by the ACT's Sally Moylan) in the women's Grand Final.

Overarching CA competition rules meant that umpires were precluded from umpiring their own State or Territory teams and, because of the associated exigencies of that limitation; I was not able to stand with all umpires in the elite panel. Nevertheless, I ended up standing with five of the other seven members of this panel (doubling up with two of them) and found those experiences to be very rewarding and significant learning experiences for me. In addition, I did not stand in any game played by South Australia.

It goes without saying that there was one 'down-side' to this week of first class cricket at Alice Springs. And, that was the heat. It was very 'hot' indeed. During the day, the temperature hovered around 39-44 degrees and I have to say that the late morning and afternoon games were very physically demanding. While the early morning games were played in conditions which were obviously not 'quite' as hot it was, surprisingly, significantly more humid for the first hour or so while the baking sun burnt off the overnight dew on the lush outfields which graced all three major playing venues. While there was no 'radiant' heat from the sun during the evening games, the temperature was generally still around 40 degrees or more. And, at night there was never any semblance of a breeze. So, standing in those games was not all that pleasant either.

During my Thursday game, which commenced at 3.35 pm, I simply could not believe how hot it was. After the game, at around 6.30 pm, I was told that it was still 44 degrees. Game day was always an environmentally testing time for umpires, players and administrators. That's the nature of the 'Alice' in February I guess. Strangely, the players seemed to cope with the 'Alice' climatic conditions far more easily than most. A generally younger and more fit cohort is the reason for that I would suggest.

I may have set a new trend at the Imparja Cup this year because a number of the umpires in the elite panel quickly adopted my practice of having a 600 mm bottle of icy cold water brought out to me after the 12<sup>th</sup> over of each innings (and more often after that if wickets were falling). My guess is that my aggregate game day hydration intake (water; but there was a diluted Gatorade alternative) was a minimum of four litres. Hydration was a significant issue at this event and Cricket NT ground staff worked tirelessly in making sure that it did not become a major problem for anyone; players or umpires.

Darryl Harper, former Australian Test umpire, attended this event in his role as the Umpires Mentor (my words) and it certainly was an unbelievable experience to chat with him over a few beers on some evenings. I will relate some of the wonderful stories he told us more personally. Former Australian Test cricketer, Ray Bright, was another key event official at the 'Alice'. He was very approachable, affable, and an extremely interesting person to chat with. Even though I asked him several times, I am still not exactly sure what his role with CA actually is! That is what I call 'taking a low profile'.

The Imparja Cup is administered by Cricket NT and is significantly supported by CA both financially and logistically. This important cricket event on the Cricket NT and CA annual calendar was a highly professional operation this year and both organisations should be congratulated on the way this competition was organised and professionally supported.

Again, this was a fabulous experience for me and my advice to the Council member appointed to the 2014 Imparja Cup is, "*don't say you can't go!*"
