CHAIRMAN

I believe the 2013–2014 season was one with which we can all be reasonably satisfied. Whilst our numbers are such that it is always a challenge to meet the requirements of umpiring in the Grade Competitions, as well as meeting the disparate requests that come our way from other bodies, our numbers are pleasing – both in numbers of umpires standing, and numbers of days umpired. The season was particularly busy, with the added impost of other tournaments, particularly the Australian Country Cricket Championships, and the Boys U15 Championships.

Whilst our endeavours to increase our number of active umpires are a never-ending battle, it was pleasing to see the recruitment of several new umpires, some with significant experience interstate, this season. All have displayed a strong commitment to standing regularly and developing their knowledge and skills. This is the second season, at least, where we have made some headway in this regard, for which the Recruitment and Training Panel deserve kudos. Also a very effective pre-season was conducted by Andrew Shelley and his Recruitment and Training Panel, providing a splendid lead-in to our season.

During the 2013–2014 season, the Council appointed umpires to 373 of a total of 538 ACTCA sponsored or participated games. This compares to 354 of a total of 467, in the previous season. In particular, more days were umpired in Men's Grade, to make for a more "like with like" comparison.

I am grateful for the willingness of members to make themselves available on a regular basis, enabling the somewhat hectic season to progress with us being able to meet these commitments. I particularly appreciate the efforts of the Appointments Panel in making appointments consistent with the priorities of Cricket ACT and the principles of appointments established by the Council.

Stuart Grocock suffered a leg injury a couple of days before the Prime Minister's XI played England and this precluded him from standing. Despite the short notice, a ready replacement was available in the person of Simon Lightbody who, whilst still a member in the ACT, is umpiring in Sydney with significant success. This was perhaps fortuitous as, on the occasion of Simon's only other Prime Minister's XI match appointment, the match was washed out. Equally merit-worthy, two of our scorers officiated in this season's Prime Minister's XI match - Liam Baker and Darren Mattison.

Our representative umpires performed very well in a variety of matches and represented the Council with distinction. This was evidenced by the generally positive feedback received from the captains in these games and the Cricket Australia Umpires High Performance Panel Observers at those matches. Congratulations go to all of these umpires but in particular to Chris Cassin for his debut Futures League match appointment and to Deanne Young who debuted as an umpire at WNCL and Women's Twenty20 level matches and represented the ACT at the Men's Under 17 National Championships in Adelaide.

The Australian Country Championships taxed our resources somewhat and 12 umpires, all with First Grade experience, rose to the occasion and helped ensure a successful tournament. My thanks go to Ron Reinhard, who volunteered to assist with arrangements for the championship, but was saddled with far in excess of what was expected, in particular major work bringing the Playing Conditions up to date, in line with other CA Competitions.

The Council appreciates the ongoing cooperative approach Cricket ACT applies to its relationship with the Council. Ben Ryan as Cricket Administrator continues to provide the

Council with much support and assistance, greatly appreciated by those of us who deal with him. Further, the staff of ACT Cricket generally have been most helpful.

The Council's Awards for the 2013–2014 season were as follows:

- Umpire of the year (Best 1st Grade Umpire) - Kevin McCarty Medal – Terry Keel
- Best 2nd Grade Umpire – Brian Lawrence Medal – Ron Reinhard
- Lower Grades Umpire of the Year - Peter Wyche
- Derek Gould Award for Best First Year Umpire – Terry Brady
- Founders' Award – Ron Reinhard (an award made by the Chairman for service "over and above" (named in recognition of the three founding members, namely Charles Morrison, Austin Selleck, and 'Ned' Custance) for the significant demands placed on Ron during the Country Championships .

During the season a number of umpires passed significant milestones in terms of numbers of matches or days umpired, of particular note being Andrew Kopras and Stuart Grocock (50 First Grade matches), Graeme Clifton (500 days across all grades), Yohan Ramasundara (300 days) and Mark Ferris (100 days).

The above were recognised at the Council's Annual Awards night held at the Uni Pub which has become our venue for meetings, and who have done us proud throughout the season..

Again, the joys of a generally successful season are marred by the sad news of the passing of former Umpires. Peter Shepherd was Secretary of the Umpires Association for seasons 1986–1987 and 1987–1988 and Treasurer from 1988 until 1993. He was Treasurer of the Cricket Association for seasons 1976–1977 and 1977–1978. Previously, he played grade cricket for many years. He was well respected as a player, umpire and office-holder across ACT cricket.

As the Executive Committee's and other office bearers' reports that follows describe many of the season's activities and issues, I will avoid repetition.

I have had a number of discussions with Mark Vergano on the vexed issue of obtaining sponsorship. Whilst there have been a couple of "near misses", such support continues to elude us, unfortunately.

In closing I would like to express my sincere thanks to members of the Executive, other office bearers, and umpires, for the support given to me as Chair.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Council's Executive consists of its Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Finance Officer, Secretary, Scorers' Representative and the High Performance Manager (Umpires). The HPM is also the representative of the Cricket ACT Board on the Executive. At times during the season, other Council office holders were invited to attend meetings of the Executive Committee when relevant matters were to be discussed. While there is also a standing invitation to any member of the Council to attend Executive Meetings as an observer, no member took this offer up in 2013-14.

The Executive Committee convened on ten occasions during 2013-14. Meetings were usually held on the second Wednesday of the month at the Uni-Pub, Civic. Agenda for, and

minutes of, these meetings were meant to be routinely posted on the Council's web site (www.actumpires.com) as a way of facilitating the accountability of elected office holders, as well as keeping members informed about the issues being considered by the Executive. During the year, this did not work quite as well as intended and greater efforts must be made next year to improve performance on this key governance indicator.

While not all office holders were able to attend all meetings during the year (Table 1 below), the overall attendance record was extremely high.

Adam Morehouse's personal circumstances mean that he continues to find regular attendance at Executive meetings quite difficult for him and Catherine Polglase continued to act as a standing proxy for Adam at these meetings.

General Meetings

Including the Annual Seminar, six General Meetings of the Council were held between September 2013 and February 2014 and were generally convened on the third Monday of relevant months. The December General Meeting once again morphed into a very well attended Christmas social function at Black Mountain Peninsula. There was no meeting of members in March 2014 so as to facilitate attendance by them at the Council's Annual Dinner and Awards evening and no meeting in April because of the difficulty in achieving a quorum at previous April meetings.

The effort to focus the agenda of these meetings on real match day situations, field-craft, 'practical umpiring', including Laws/rules and umpiring-related developments within CA and the ACTCA was again continued. Some meetings were extremely interesting for those attending.

A combined total of 143 members attended these six meetings, giving rise to an average attendance of 24.0 members, reflecting a continuation of improved member participation in the business of the Council over recent years.

Membership

There was a small increase in membership of the Council and it was fortunate indeed in that it was able to recruit, train and regularly appoint to games a number of new and younger members.

In its last three Annual Reports, the Council highlighted the fact that it is heavily reliant on the regular availability of about 20 members (or about half of the total number of standing umpires). Over the course of last few seasons, nothing much has changed although it could be reasonably argued that things have improved. While the table below is self explanatory, it is worthy of further comment.

This historical table reflects that 22 members stood on a minimum of 21.2 days during 2013-14. Those numbers are around the trend since 2001-02. In addition, some six members stood on a minimum of 18 days during the season. Taking that into account 2013-14, compared to the previous seasons, again reflected a much greater propensity of active members to share the umpiring workload, offset by the fact that a small number of members stood very infrequently.

Overall, this year reflected a very good participation outcome for the Council. And, it needed to because the weather was kind to ACT cricket during the season with very few games being impacted by wet weather. In addition, with the Australian Country Cricket Championships, the Boy's Under 15 Carnival and a range of other non grade games played in Canberra during the season, appointments were made to 123 more days of cricket compared to appointments made in 2012-13. However, our increased active member base still made it impossible for the Council to be able to appoint to all games played. See associated report from the Manager, Appointments.

By way of comparison;

2010-11

44 per cent of active members accounted for 75 per cent of days stood (16 members accounted for 509 days, with a mean of nearly 32 days per core member).

2011-12

50 per cent of active members accounted for 77 per cent of days stood (19 members accounted for 575 days with a mean of 30 days per core member).

2012-13

50 per cent of active members accounted for 71 per cent of days stood (19 members accounted for 592 days with a mean of 31 days per core member). Nine other members accounted for 176 days with a mean of 20 days per core member).

2013-14

50 per cent of active members accounted for 78 per cent of days stood (23 members accounted for 721 days with a mean of 31 days per core member). Nine other members accounted for 162 days with a mean of 18 days per core member.

In each of its Annual Reports of recent years, the Council made the observation that the age profile of the current membership is, or should be, of significant concern. That concern eased somewhat last season and, pleasingly, the cohort of members recruited this season is young overall and that bodes well for the Council. At the same time, the now, medium and long term recruitment focus of the Council must remain on garnering and retaining younger members.

Issues Discussed by the Executive during the Year

The Executive discussed a number of substantive issues during the year, including:

- Life Membership and Membership of the Council.
- Umpire of the Year awards – the procedures used for determining these.
- The Standing Minutes
- A 'tidy-up' of ACTCA Competition Rules for 2014-15
- Council equipment for 2014-15
- Inter-connectivity and working relationships between ACTCA and the Council.

Other Council Activities

While membership of the Council has increased slightly, as is evidenced elsewhere in this Annual Report, recruitment and retention of younger members is a key challenge into the future and remains an ongoing issue of focus for the Executive.

In a volunteer organisation, thanks are due to every member who made any contribution to the burden of umpiring, scoring and/or administration, along with the families, friends and others who missed out on the time and energy that they devoted to ACT cricket. The support provided by 'Manuka' - Mark Vergano and his staff at Cricket ACT – should be acknowledged, particularly the work of Martin Garoni and Ben Ryan.

As usual, the season started with the Annual Training Seminar in September, and we are once again indebted to Andrew Shelley and all those who provided assistance on the day. Member feedback suggests that this Seminar was a highly successful one and the presence of Sean Easey from Cricket Australia added significantly to the professionalism of this event. Significantly, a number of potential new umpires attended and quite a few of them went on to obtain their Level 2 qualification and stand in Council appointed games over the season.

This year's Annual Dinner and Awards Night held at 'The Uni Pub' in Civic, put together once again by the experienced organisation team comprised of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Mark Ferris. Many thanks again for their marvellous contributions towards what was an enjoyable and successful night. The Awards Committee also deserves accolades for the professional and transparent way in which they performed their thankless task this year. Well done.

In a season in which the ACT's various representative teams achieved significantly on the field of play, it is appropriate to offer our congratulations on their achievements to the members of the ACT Elite Umpires Panel (Yohan Ramasundara, Chris Cassin and Stu Grocock), along with Mark Ferris, Deanne Young and Melissa Jones; our Emerging Umpires Panel members, under the expert guidance of Terry Keel in his key role of the Council's High Performance Manager.

However, as ever, the Council's 'core' business remains the appointment of umpires to ACTCA graded matches every Saturday, a number of Sundays and often mid week games as well. Umpire appointments is an outcome which takes into account Grade Cricket Committee expectations, games which need to be appointed to, relative standard of those games, umpire availability, demonstrated umpire ability, mentoring of new umpires, appointment equity and a number of other often subtle issues which need to be considered. This is not an easy task.

This important and vital responsibility falls to our Appointments Panel, chaired this year by Ron Reinhard. It is appropriate to record our thanks to Ron and his panel members, Bryan Climas, Alan Jordan and Stu Grocock (part), for their very good work during the season.

Grade Cricket Committee

The Grade Cricket Committee (GCC) is the body which runs the various ACTCA competitions, and the Council is represented on it by the Deputy Chairman or proxies such as Bill Ruse. All of the eight clubs plus the Women's Council also have a single representative on the GCC. Decisions concerning the format of games playing conditions and by-laws are decided in this forum.

Last season's prevailing good will and commonsense was again manifested this year, with a number of sensible solutions to emerging issues being reached. Many of the matters discussed at GCC are of marginal significance to umpires and scorers per se (eg the registration of players), but the Council's views are always welcomed and respected by the GCC and the respective clubs.

FINANCE OFFICER

FINANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

This is my 15th consecutive Finance Officer's report. It must be some kind of record!

The budget for this year was for a \$1,400 deficit. The final outcome was a deficit of \$1,416.12 which is pretty close to the budget.

The income from membership subscriptions has risen from \$2,814 last season to \$3,045. This consisted of 37 full members, 7 associate members and 6 scorer members.

This season's Umpires Annual Dinner was held at the Uni Pub in the City. From all accounts, our members were very satisfied with this new venue. The usual organising committee comprising of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Mark Ferris did a splendid job in organising this event. The overall deficit for the dinner was \$205 which was incurred by us covering costs of invited guests and which was in line with expectations.

Income from the Development Levy showed an increase from \$829 in 2012/2013 to \$953. This represents a highest number of umpire days stood since season 2001-02 (954 days). This outcome was aided by the fact that the Australian Country Cricket Championships and the Boys Under 15 Championships were held in Canberra this season. These two events contributed 77 standing days between them. There was also an increased number of standing days in Men's T20 matches (from 102 to 108) and the increased number of standing days in Men's Grade (from 582 to 614).

The following table shows the amounts received by umpires during last season.

Cameron Allen, Liam Baker, Jeremy Marples, Darren Mattison, Rammanee Shivakkumar and Anne Sutherland were appointed to Women's National Cricket League and WNCL Twenty20 matches. Cameron Allen, Liam Baker, and Rammanee Shivakkumar were appointed to Futures League matches. Liam Baker and Darren Mattison were selected to score the Prime Minister's XI match against England played at Manuka Oval. I would also like to congratulate Liam Baker who made his debut as a scorer in the Prime Minister's XI series of matches.

The scorer ranks became thin at times during the season due to work commitments and health issues of several long term scorers. I would like to thank Liam Baker and Rammanee Shivakkumar who shouldered the burden of scoring a large number of matches this season. Also I would like to welcome Cameron Allen to the grade and representative scoring ranks in Canberra this season.

I would like to thank all scorer members who took time from their lives to score representative, grade and school cricket during the 2013-14 season. A number of people scored for the first time at grade and school level and I wish that they have a long and enjoyable experience scoring at whatever level they choose.

HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER

Season 2013-14 was a challenging one in terms of fielding umpires to officiate in the ACT's representative matches. There were numerous matches hosted in the ACT and surrounding regions which were played under Cricket Australia competition rules. These included WNCL One-Day matches, Women's T20 matches, Futures League Cup matches (4-day affairs between the ACT Comets and States second XI teams), and of course, the prestigious annual Prime Minister's XI match.

Such a large number of matches presented some challenges in terms of ensuring suitably experienced and credentialed umpires could be appointed to these games. However it was pleasing to note that, almost without exception, our appointed umpires performed admirably in these high-pressure games, bringing credit to the ACTCA and the Umpires & Scorers Council.

As ACT Cricket Umpires' High Performance Manager, my role is to mentor and oversee the training and development of our Council members who are being considered for representative appointments. Jointly with the Chair of the Appointments Panel, it is our responsibility to appoint umpires whom we think will best serve the Council in various representative and high-profile matches during the season.

I extend my commiserations to "Disco" Stu Grocock, who was appointed to umpire the Prime Minister's XI match for the second successive year, only to be forced to withdraw when he sustained a serious leg injury umpiring an Australian Country Cricket Championship match a few days before the big game. Stu's injury proved to be long-term, however to his credit, rather than dwell on his misfortune, he acted as Observer's assistant to Alan Jordan for the rest of the season. Due to the imminence of the PM's XI match, we were caught short in terms of finding a replacement for the PM's XI match; in the event, Simon Lightbody, who was commuting to and standing in Sydney Grade cricket this season, fortunately was able to step into the breach at short notice.

Special thanks also to Bill Ruse, who agreed to help me out by sharing the workload of the official UHPP Observer cum Match Referee duties in several WNCL 50-over, WT20 and Futures League matches during the season. Between the two of us, Rusey and I officiated in 20 such matches, and while being Observer/ Match Referee is not a patch on actually standing out in the middle and umpiring (it's a bit like kissing one's sister!), we managed to muddle through without too many dramas for the most part.

I would like to note that the Umpires' Council is fortunate to again be blessed with a solid blend of youth and experience among its representative umpires. Happily, we look like being in the fortunate situation of being spoilt for choice in deciding which umpires will comprise the 2014-15 Representative Panel, with a number of umpires new to our ranks coming under notice with consistent, professional displays this season. While this is likely to cause headaches at the selection table, it can only be a good thing for ACT cricket in the long term.

APPOINTMENTS MANAGER

I would like to thank the members of the appointments panel (Bryan Climas, Alan Jordan, Nick Ewbank and Stuart Grocock) for their assistance and insightful comments during the weekly appointments meetings.

During the 2013/14 Cricket Season the council appointed umpires to a 373 of a total of 538 ACTCA sponsored or participated games. During the season, several members raised the issue of colour fading of the current type of on-field umpire shirt and suggested to the Executive that the Council put in place arrangements for a new style of apparel for the upcoming season with an initial provision of an on field umpiring shirt to members being funded by the Council.

The Executive gave this proposal serious consideration and, after discussions with Cricket ACT, has been able to give effect to this member initiative. Accordingly, Council umpires will be wearing a new make and style of on-field shirt next season; one which hopefully will be resistant to colour fading. The Council will be providing each of its active umpires one of these new shirts at no cost. The cost of these shirts has been funded from the High Performance Manager's budget.

The sizing templates of the new style on-field umpire shirts is slightly different after size 3XL, where 5XL is an average of 4XL and 5XL common standards and where 7XL is an average of 7XL and 8XL common standards. Our new supplier for on-field umpiring shirts does not manufacture apparel in sizes 4XL, 6XL or 8XL and has informed the Executive that it's sizing strategy (as above) for manufacturing apparel in sizes larger than 3XL has not met with any negative client feedback.

It was also very pleasing to see how the season's new umpires quickly gained in confidence and field craft; some to the extent that they were appointed to first grade. Many of the new umpires participated in discussions around practical issues relating to umpiring which were often held after the monthly meetings of the Council.

UNDER 17 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Under 17 National Championships were held in Adelaide during January 2014. The two weeks of the tournament included a number of record temperatures as it was during the national heat wave experienced across the country. Despite the conditions, there was a lot of good cricket played by all the boys selected to represent their States and Territories.

I was a member of an eight-person team of officials with umpires travelling from all the States and Territories. The standard of umpiring was high across the board and this provided a huge opportunity for my development as an umpire. The range of pre-match, post-match and in-game processes and procedures of the other officials was educational and I have begun to develop my own routines taking some from the other officials and modifying others.

It was unfortunate we didn't have the opportunity to officiate with each of the other officials as there were only five games to umpire across the two weeks. We were able to officiate on all the teams involved with a good spread of games for each official.

My schedule for the two weeks began with a 50 over game between Queensland and the Northern Territory. It was an amazing first day with the mercury breaking 40 early on in the morning. The best thing about this game was getting the first over of the match, not so good when the first ball is a massive front foot no ball. I was somewhat nervous but that was quickly dispensed with as the match progressed.

This led to an eventful second game. It was another 50 over match, this time between South Australia and Western Australia. This game had it all; less than ideal changing facilities, tight decisions, good cricket and even lightning. We even left the field with South Australia needing all of 2 runs to cement an extra point win. With no official Duckworth-Lewis available, we used the 30-30 rule as a guide and we were able to get back on the field and resume play. There was then a wicket giving Western Australia a glimmer of hope but the SACA boys pulled together to finish off the game.

After a rest day, a very well earned rest day, the 2-day games began.

For me they began with ACT versus Tasmania in a good match with some outstanding efforts with the bat by the ACT boys and the only game of the round to go the full distance. The rest of the games had finished well before this one. The next two games were by the far the toughest of the fortnight.

First up was NSW versus Victoria. It was fiery, with a number of players being spoken to about appealing in a slightly over-exuberant manner. Cricket Australia is very hard on this kind of stuff because they want to instil that inherent respect for the match official at all levels. This was tough game which had a large number of close calls, mostly around LBW, but was enjoyable none-the-less. Overall, I was happy with my own performance.

Next was NSW versus Queensland. The old rivalry! There is no doubt that this rivalry is alive and well and will continue for a very long time. The game was hard fought, with players pushing themselves to the limit, as the tournament was still up for grabs. This game had a bowler take a 6-wicket haul, had some very good batting and controversy over the tea break. When the last hour arrived, however, the fortnight was settled with neither of these teams winning the tournament. This game involved a few more nerves from me as it was a back-to-back NSW game and the Queensland captain's dad had come to watch for a bit (the captain being Tom Healy, Ian Healy's son).

It is still somewhat amazing to me that many of the young men who played in the games will represent at higher levels for their states and even Australia. Congratulations to South Australia on winning the 2014 Championships.

The generally prevailing heat over the fortnight was dealt with by beginning games earlier in the day, adding additional drinks breaks, modifying playing conditionals to allow teams to manage and monitor their player's health more effectively and cutting sessions from the hottest days of play.

As with the experience of Mark in last season's tournament, teamwork was key. Working together on the field through effective communication was viewed very positively. As was contributing to the debriefing sessions held after each day's play. These debriefing sessions were instrumental in helping all the officials to develop confidence as decisions and scenarios were discussed and on-field calls determined to be correct the majority of the time. It was also a great opportunity to learn about other official's methods and thought processes meaning we all learnt so much from each other. This, when put together with the match reports from the umpire coaching crew for the tournament, will allow each and every one of the umpires who attended to further develop as umpires and ultimately become better people as well.

Teamwork was also looked for off the field and not just at the daily debriefing. Learning about each other as people was also looked for. This entailed a number of social activities, mostly dinners, which were very enjoyable (or so my scales told me after I returned home) as well as a couple of Big Bash Games. Some of these dinners were particularly enlightening in an officiating sense as we were able to include some the Big Bash umpires and "pick their brains" about the game in general. This was especially true with Sam Nogajski from Tasmania.

Some of the biggest things I have taken away from the tournament are learn from mistakes, learn from each other, communication, no matter how small, is important and working with a team approach is very valuable. Personally I have been developing new procedures within my game such as clicking over my counter and putting it in my pocket after the fifth ball (after all there is no longer anything to count in the over) and walking

with purpose (head up, eyes on the play and without turning your back to the most important part of the field; the pitch). There was also some discussion about whether umpires should move across the pitch between the stumps or whether going around was better. I decided that going around was better, were practical, as this allowed for the building of mutual respect between umpires and players as suggested by Steve Davis, one of our leading national umpires.

A big thank you to Terry Keel, our High Performance Manager, for nominating me for this tournament. It was a wonderful opportunity and an incredible experience. I'd also like to thank Bob Parry from CA for his efforts during the tournament in helping all of us umpires develop our games throughout the fortnight. I would most definitely recommend anyone who is offered this opportunity to take it with both hands as there is almost no better development opportunity when you are early on in your officiating career.
