CHAIRMAN

The 2014–2015 season was again one with which we can all be reasonably satisfied. Whilst our numbers are such that it is always a challenge to meet the requirements of umpiring in the Grade Competitions, as well as meeting the disparate requests that come our way from other bodies, our numbers are pleasing. Over the season, our numbers available were much the same as the previous season.

It was pleasing to see the recruitment of several new umpires, some with experience interstate, this season. All have displayed a strong commitment to standing regularly and developing their knowledge and skills. This is the third season, at least, where we have made some headway in this regard. Also a very interesting & varied pre-season Seminar was conducted by Andrew Shelley and his Recruitment and Training Panel, providing a very good refresher prior to our season.

Late in the season we ran a Level 1 course for several umpires who are keen to umpire Grade cricket. These individuals were then initially appointed to 5th grade, and have generally shown enough to suggest they should become competent Grade umpires, assuming they pass the Level 2 course in the off-season.

I particularly appreciate the efforts of the Appointments Panel to make appointments consistent with the priorities of Cricket ACT and the principles of appointment established by the Council. It is a time-consuming task, and I am sure they are most familiar with the adage of its being impossible to please all of the people all of the time!

Our representative umpires performed very well in a variety of matches and represented the Council with distinction. This was evidenced by the generally positive feedback received from the captains in these games. There was a busy schedule, with 4 World Cup warm-up matches – ACT v Afghanistan and Ireland – before the season proper.

Equally busy were the scorers, with all of these matches.

Of particular note are the efforts of Adam Morehouse, who scored for the Sydney Test, as well as all World Cup matches at the SCG, including a semi-final.

The Council appreciates the ongoing cooperative approach Cricket ACT applies to its relationship with the Council. Ben Ryan as Cricket Administrator continues to provide the Council with much support and assistance, greatly appreciated by those of us who deal with him. Particular mention should be made of the outgoing CEO, Mark Vergano. Mark has always been very supportive of the Council, and has engaged cooperatively and proactively with us. Noting that some years ago he was an accomplished umpire in Sydney, I am hopeful we may be able to utilise his services, though he would need to re-qualify!!

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Council's Executive consists of its Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Finance Officer, Secretary, Scorers' Representative and the High Performance Manager (Umpires). The HPM

is also the representative of the Cricket ACT Board on the Executive. At times during the season, other Council office holders were invited to attend meetings of the Executive Committee when relevant matters were to be discussed. There is also a standing invitation to any member of the Council to attend Executive Meetings as an observer and one member took this offer up in 2014-15. In addition, three members attended part of a meeting of the Executive.

The Executive Committee convened on 10 occasions during 2014-15. Meetings were usually held on the second Wednesday of the month at the Uni-Pub, Civic. Agenda for, and minutes of, these meetings were meant to be routinely posted on the Council's web site (www.actumpires.com) as a way of facilitating the accountability of elected office holders, as well as keeping members informed about the issues being considered by the Executive. Once again, this did not work quite as well as intended and greater efforts must be made next year to improve performance on this key governance indicator.

While not all Executive office holders were able to attend all meetings during the year (Table 1 below), the overall attendance record was extremely high.

Adam Morehouse's personal circumstances mean that he continues to find regular attendance at Executive meetings quite difficult for him and Catherine Polglase continued to act as a standing proxy for Adam at these meetings. Each of Peter McCann's three absences were attributable to now resolved health issues

General Meetings

Including the Annual Seminar, six General Meetings of the Council were held between September 2014 and February 2015 and were generally convened on the third Monday of relevant months. The December General Meeting once again morphed into a very well attended Christmas social function at the Uni Pub. There was no meeting of members in March 2015 so as to facilitate attendance by them at the Council's Annual Dinner and Awards evening and no meeting in April 2015 because of the historical difficulty in achieving a quorum at previous April meetings.

The effort to focus the agenda of these meetings on real match day situations, field-craft, 'practical umpiring', including Laws/rules and umpiring-related developments within CA and the ACTCA was again continued. Some meetings were extremely interesting for those attending and we had some very interesting guest speakers from time to time.

A combined total of 167 members attended these six meetings, giving rise to an average attendance of 28 members, further reflecting a continuation of improved member participation which has been a feature of the business of the Council over recent years.

Membership

There was a small increase in membership of the Council and it was fortunate indeed in that it was able to recruit, train and regularly appoint to games a number of new and younger members.

In its last three or four Annual Reports, the Council highlighted the fact that it is heavily reliant on the regular availability of about 20 members (or about half of the total number of standing umpires). Over the course of last few seasons, nothing much has changed although it could be reasonably argued that things have improved. While the table below is self-explanatory, it is worthy of further comment.

This historical table reflects that 23 members stood on a minimum of 16.6 days during 2014-15. Those numbers are broadly around the trend since 2001-02. Taking that into account 2014-15, compared to the previous seasons, again reflected a much greater propensity of active members to share the umpiring workload, offset by the fact that a number of members stood very infrequently.

The main reason why the number of mean days stood by an active umpires has dropped so significantly, is the increase in the number of members who did not stand on many days. For example, 15 members stood on 10 days or less and eight stood on 5 days or less. Injuries and a late Level 1 recruitment drive were the main components of the reasons for larger than normal overall umpire unavailability.

Overall, this year reflected a very good participation outcome for the Council. And, it needed to because the weather was kind to ACT cricket during the season with very few games being impacted by wet weather. In addition, with the increased number of

representative and other non-grade game played in Canberra during the season, and which needed to be appointed to, the Appointments Panel, and the High Performance Manager, was constantly busy. However, our increased active member base still made it impossible for the Council to be able to appoint to all games played. See associated report from the Manager, Appointments.

In each of its Annual Reports of recent years, the Council made the observation that the age profile of the current membership is, or should be, of significant concern. That concern eased somewhat in 2013-14 and, pleasingly, the cohort of members recruited this season is generally young overall and that bodes well for the Council. At the same time, the now, medium and long term recruitment focus of the Council must remain on garnering and retaining younger members.

Issues Discussed by the Executive during the Year

The Executive discussed a number of substantive issues during the year, including:

- The changing nature of the role of the High Performance Manager
- Membership of the Council.
- Recruitment and training of Level 1 umpires
- Migration of the Council website to the CACT portal
- Council equipment for 2015-16
- Inter-connectivity and working relationships between ACTCA and the Council.

Other Council Activities

While membership of the Council has increased slightly, as is evidenced elsewhere in this report, recruitment and retention of younger members is a key challenge into the future and remains an ongoing issue of focus for the Executive.

In a volunteer organisation, thanks are due to every member who made any contribution to the burden of umpiring, scoring and/or administration, along with the families, friends and others who missed out on the time and energy that they devoted to ACT cricket. The support provided by those at Cricket ACT should be acknowledged, particularly the very good work of outgoing CEO, Mark Vergano.

As usual, the season started with the Annual Training Seminar in September, and we are once again indebted to Andrew Shelley and all those who provided assistance on the day. Member feedback suggests that this Seminar was a highly successful one. Significantly, a number of potential new umpires attended and quite a few of them went on to obtain their Level 2 qualification and stand in Council appointed games over the season. Late in the season, the Council conducted an abridged Level 1 training course and four of those attendees stood in a number of lower grade games. Hopefully, these Level 1 umpires will complete the training, pass the exam, and progress to full Level 2 status later this year.

This year's Annual Dinner and Awards Night was again held at 'The Uni Pub' in Civic. This well attended Council event was put together once again by the experienced organisation team comprised of Barry Thomas, Catherine Polglase and Mark Ferris. Many thanks again for their marvellous contributions towards what was an enjoyable and successful night. The Awards Committee also deserves accolades for the professional and transparent way in which they performed their thankless task this year. Well done.

In a season in which the ACT's various representative teams achieved significantly on the field of play, it is appropriate to offer our congratulations on their achievements to the members of the ACT Representative Umpires Panel (Yohan Ramasundara, Chris Cassin, Andrew Shelley and Mark Ferris), along with Deanne Young and Andrew Crozier; our Emerging Umpires Panel members, under the expert guidance of Terry Keel in his key role of the Council's High Performance Manager. Early in the season, Mark Ferris was elevated from the Emerging Umpires Panel to the Representative Umpires Panel after Stuart Grocock opted to umpire this season in the NSW Grade Competition.

However, as ever, the Council's 'core' business remains the appointment of umpires to ACTCA graded matches every Saturday, a number of Sundays and often mid-week games as well. Umpire appointments is an outcome which takes into account Grade Cricket Committee expectations, games which need to be appointed to, relative standard of those games, umpire availability, demonstrated umpire ability, mentoring of new umpires, appointment equity and a number of other often subtle issues which need to be considered. This is not an easy task.

This important and vital responsibility falls to our Appointments Panel, chaired this year by David Markham. It is appropriate to record our thanks to David and his panel members, Bryan Climas, Ron Reinhard and for their very good work during the season.

Grade Cricket Committee

The Grade Cricket Committee (GCC) is the body which runs the various ACTCA competitions, and the Council is represented on it by the Deputy Chairman or proxies such as Bill Ruse. All of the eight clubs plus the Women's Council also have a single representative on the GCC. Decisions concerning the format of games playing conditions and by-laws are decided in this forum.

Last season's prevailing good will and common sense was again manifested this year, with a number of sensible solutions to emerging issues being reached. Many of the matters discussed at GCC are of marginal significance to umpires and scorers per se (e.g. the registration of players), but the Council's views are always welcomed and respected by the GCC and the respective clubs.

FINANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

The budget for this year was for a \$430 surplus. The final outcome was a surplus of \$1,025 which is very pleasing. The main reasons for the surplus were higher than expected membership subscriptions (\$464 over budget) and lower than expected expenditure on umpire bonuses (\$440 under budget).

The income from membership subscriptions has risen from \$3,045 last season to \$3,464. This consisted of 41 full members, 7 associate members and 5 scorer members.

This season's Umpires Annual Dinner was again held at the Uni Pub in the City. The overall deficit for the dinner was \$286 which was incurred by the Council covering costs of 3 invited guests and the absorbed cost of 4 late withdrawals.

Income from the Development Levy showed a decrease from \$953 in 2013/2014 to \$812. This outcome was affected by the fact that the Australian Country Cricket Championships and the Boys under 15 championships were held in Canberra last season and no similar events were held in Canberra in the 2014-2015 season. These two events contributed 77 standing days between them. However, there was also a decreased number of standing days in Men's T20 matches (from 108 to 77), a decreased number of standing days in Women's Grade (from 73 to 66) and a decreased number of standing days in Men's Grade (from 614 to 606).

The following table shows the amounts received by umpires during last season.

In 2013-2014, umpires received \$89,967.50 for 953 umpiring days at a daily average of \$94.40.

Finally, the Umpire Bonus system was again operating this season. 11 members received \$210.00 each for a total outlay of \$2,310.00.

The 2014-15 season was again a busy season for the ACT Scorers' Committee in terms of representative scoring commitments. We are very grateful for our continuing strong relationship with the ACT Umpires & Scorers' Council and Cricket ACT. We would also like to thank Mark Vergano for his commitment to scorers in the Canberra region and the support he has given the profession during his long and valued term as the Cricket ACT CEO.

For the first time in the history of the ACT Scorers' Committee, we had a full complement of committee members. Cameron Allen joined the scorers committee this season joining Darren Mattison, Rammanee Shivakkumar, Catherine Polglase and myself on the committee. I would like to thank the committee for their hard work this season and especially Catherine who filled in for me at executive committee meetings due to work and family commitments. Catherine Polglase and I comprised the scorers' selection panel for the 2014-15 season. Also a big thank you to the ACT Umpires & Scorers' Council Executive, especially Bill Ruse, Peter McCann and the rest of the executive of the ACTU&SC for all their help in the past season and to Ben Ryan, Martin Garoni and Mark Vergano at Cricket ACT for all their assistance.

The representative commitment for scorers this season heavier compared to previous seasons and it was a credit to those scorers who put their names forward to score representative matches this season. We were down in numbers this season due to people becoming unavailable to score due to various reasons and I would like to thank Liam Baker and Rammanee Shivakkumar who shouldered much of the scoring burden this season.

In addition to ACT Meteors and ACT Comets matches, scorers were required for the World Cup, a VB Series One Day International, the Prime Minister's XI match, two women's tour matches between a CA Chairman's XI and the West Indies and a tour match between the ACT XI and the touring English side.

I would like to congratulate Darren Mattison on his representative appointments with New South Wales this season where he was appointed to score his initial first-class match. He was also appointed to score several Matador One-Day Cup matches. Due to a work transfer, Darren has moved to Brisbane and we wish Darren and his family the best in the sunshine state. Cameron Allen, Liam Baker, Darren Mattison, Adam Morehouse and Rammanee Shivakkumar were appointed to representative matches in the ACT.

Liam Baker and Rammanee Shivakkumar were selected to score the Prime Minister's XI match against England played at Manuka Oval. I would also like to congratulate Rammanee Shivakkumar who made her debut as a scorer in the Prime Minister's XI series of matches.

I would like to thank all scorer members who took time from their lives to score representative, grade and school cricket during the 2014-15 season. Due to changes in the structure of women's representative cricket in the forthcoming season, there will be less matches available to score at a representative level in Canberra which will be disappointing for scorers who have consistently scored at a representative level. The scorers committee will focus more on the development of scorers in the forthcoming seasons with a focus on scorers at a grade and school level.

Personally I would like to thank the Council on awarding me the Founders Award. I feel privileged and honoured to be presented this award and I accepted this award on behalf of all scorers in the ACT.

Member Achievements during 2014-15

Canberra cricket is blessed to have at its disposal such a wealth of talented and dedicated cricket umpires and scorers. A number of umpires and scorers officiated in important matches or achieved significant milestones during season 2014/15. Some of the more noteworthy achievements or milestones included:

- **Yohan Ramasundara**, **Chris Cassin** and **Mark Ferris** all stood in 4-day Futures League matches involving the ACT Comets and visiting States 2nd XI teams at Manuka Oval. These umpires, together with **Andrew Crozier**, **Andrew Shelley** and **Deanne Young** officiated at Women's T20 and WNCL matches involving the ACT Tradies Meteors and visiting States national women's teams.
- **Chris Cassin**, a product of rural NSW with more than 10 years' experience umpiring in Sydney and Canberra, was appointed to stand in his first Prime Minister's XI match (PM's XI v MCC XI) at Manuka Oval.
- **Deanne Young** had the distinction of officiating at the Cricket Australia Women's Under 18 Championships in Bendigo. **Deanne** also represented the ACT in the International Women's Challenge Tournament played in Hastings, New Zealand.
- **Terry Keel** umpired his 11th First Grade grand final in 2014/15, with his partner for the match, **Yohan Ramasundara** standing in his 7th First Grade grand final. **Terry** and **Yohan** have stood together in the last 5 First Grade grand finals.
- **Adam Morehouse** scored in the 3rd Test of the Australia v India Test Match series at the SCG. **Adam** was also appointed as an official scorer for several One Day Internationals as part of the ICC World Cup in 2015.
- **Terry Keel** was this year's Kevin McCarty medallist, with the McCarty Medal being awarded to the First Grade Umpire of the Year. **Anthony Dolin** was awarded the Brian Lawrence medal for Best 2nd Grade Umpire. **Brendan Furze** received the Derek Gould Memorial Medal for Best First Year Umpire.

- **Liam Baker** and **Raminee Shivakkumar** regularly scored at Futures League, WNCL and WT20 level during the season. **Liam** was also recognised as the winner of the inaugural ACTCU&S Scorers Award for Best Scorer.
- **Bill Ruse** and **Terry Keel** stood together in the Queanbeyan v GWB Round 12 1st Grade match, which was for both of them their 200th 1st Grade match as umpires.



- **Andrew Crozier** represented the ACT with distinction as an umpire at the Cricket Australia Under 17's Men's Championships in Hobart.

HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER

As High Performance Manager I am responsible for selecting, managing and developing representative-level umpires, who are appointed to stand in all representative cricket matches played in the Territory. I do this by developing and delivering training activities for this cohort of umpires, and arranging as necessary training from external providers. In this role I also interact regularly with Cricket Australia and my counterpart State Directors of Umpiring.

As in previous seasons, the ACT's High Performance Panel of umpires was made up of a Representative Panel (comprising experienced umpires whose primary focus was on 4-day Futures League matches) and a Development Panel (consisting of umpires with less experience in standing at the representative level). In Season 2014-15, the ACT's Representative Panel of Umpires comprised: **Chris Cassin, Mark Ferris, Yohan Ramasundara** and **Andrew Shelley**, while this season's Development Panel consisted of **Andrew Crozier** and **Deanne Young**.

Season 2014-15 was a busy one at the representative level. With Australia hosting the ICC World Cup, a spin-off was there were lots of opportunities for our umpires to gain exposure umpiring at the representative level, by standing in several World Cup trial matches. This augmented our standard fare of WNCL, WT20 and Futures League matches, a number of which were hosted by the ACT representative teams at Manuka Oval.

I facilitated a number of umpire development opportunities this season. Notable amongst these was an interactive training and development session held in November at the Goulburn Workers Club, run by my good friend and NSW SDU counterpart, Darren Goodger. This was a terrific session which was very well attended by most of our Representative Panel umpires, as well as several umpires who, although not part of the Representative Panel, are very highly regarded and ear-marked for representative honours in the not too distant future.

Later in the season Council members were very lucky to be addressed by a group of ICC umpires who were in town officiating at a World Cup cricket match. The Q&A session, at which Richard Kettlebrough, Joel Wilson, Steve Davis, Aleem Dar and Simon Taufel spoke, was our best-attended monthly meeting for many a long year and was very well received by the members.

There were many season highlights for individual umpires, including –

- **Dee Young** being invited by CA to officiate at the Under 21 Women's Tournament in New Zealand and the Under 18 Female National Championships in Ballarat, at which she umpired very well. Earlier in the season Deanne was also invited to umpire some Southern Stars (Australian National Women's team) trial matches in Brisbane.
- **Andrew Crozier** was appointed to umpire at the Under 17 Male Championships, which were held in Hobart in December and by all reports, he umpired very well and made a good impression there.
- **Chris Cassin** was the ACT's appointment to this year's Prime Minister's XI (against the "old enemy", England). Chris umpired proficiently on the big stage in front of a sizeable crowd at Manuka Oval and he thoroughly enjoyed the experience.
- **Yohan Ramasundara** grasped a late-season opportunity to stand in a 4-day Futures League match, played between South Australia and Western Australia at Prospect Oval, Adelaide. This was arranged under Cricket Australia's Umpire Rotation policy, and I know that Yohan welcomed the opportunity of umpiring players away from the usual confines of Manuka Oval, and he benefited from being observed and receiving feedback from Cricket Australia's UHPP panel member.

Appointments Manager

During the course of the 2014/15 season the Appointments Panel appointed 48 umpires to games. The number of games umpired by these various umpires ranged from one to nearly 30. A significant number of umpires were not regularly available – some for instance still play grade or city and suburban cricket so that they are only available on Sundays. Most others have varying outside commitments during the season.

Consequently, as in past years, it has been impossible to appoint two umpires, or in a number of cases any umpires at all, to all games. While this is a matter of regret, the panel has, in consultation with Cricket ACT, utilised strategies to cover as broad a range of matches as possible. The agreed formula is that first grade men's games have 2 umpires; second grade men's games have two umpires in at least 50% of games and third, fourth and fifth grade have umpires as often as possible. The panel keeps records of games appointed to, and tries to have umpires appointed to a roughly equivalent number of games for each team in third and fourth grade particularly.

The panel also appoints two umpires to all representative games within its remit, such as junior representative games. We also try to appoint two umpires to women's games as often as possible, although in the early part of the season this can be difficult as the women's games clash with junior rep games.

In making appointments, the panel attempts to spread umpires around, so that each person partners different umpires and handles different teams as often as possible. This is restricted to some extent by the number of teams in some competitions – for instance an umpire who stands in women's games each Sunday in a six team competition will obviously umpire the same teams a number of times during a season.

Contrary to apparent belief in some circles, the panel pays minor regard to geographical issues in making appointments. While we try to make appointments convenient for standing umpires, no umpire has expressed an unwillingness to stand at any particular ground in Canberra.

The panel has also given consideration to whether broader coverage could be achieved by appointing one umpire to more lower-grade games. This is however not always an ideal solution. For umpires to reach and maintain the requisite standard it is desirable for them to stand frequently with other umpires who act as a sort of quality control mechanism. Lower grades are also where we generally place our less experienced umpires, and the panel is loath to make them stand alone except on rare occasions.

During 2014/15, excluding finals in all of which two umpires were appointed, the following appointments were made:

- First grade – two umpires for all one day games, two day games, Konica Cup and SCG Cup matches played in the local area.
- Second grade – in one day and two day matches, of 56 games, 33 had two umpires and 23 one umpire, although it should be noted that in a small number of two day games there were two umpires on one day and one on the other; in Division 2 T20 10 games had two umpires, 6 had one umpire and two no umpire (this occurred on a Sunday afternoon when there was a multitude of fixtures).

- Third grade – in one and two day matches, of 56 games, 24 had two umpires, 10 one umpire, and the remainder no umpires. 2 Division 3 T20 games had two umpires and 12 games one umpire.
- Fourth grade – in one and two day matches, of 56 games, 19 had two umpires, 3 one umpire and the remainder no umpires. 2 Division 4 T20 games had two umpires and 12 games one umpire.
- Fifth grade – 12 regular season games had two umpires, and 1 game one umpire.
- Women's – of 45 games (20 over and 40 over combined) 35 had two umpires; 8 had one umpire, and no umpire was available for 2 games.

UMPIRES' OBSERVER

After several years of service Alan Jordan stood down as umpires' observer prior to the start of the 2014/15 season. Ron Reinhard was asked to stand in as umpires' observer as he was not expected to be available for the full season. When starting as umpires' observer Ron sought advice from Alan Jordan on his process and methodology.

It is recommended that prior to the start of the 2015/16 season the High Performance Manager seek advice from Cricket Australia on the process and methodologies they recommend be employed by association's when observing umpires. This should include some explanation as to what Cricket Australia expect from umpires who are being proposed for higher representative honours (examples could include use of tic-tac-toe and basic / advanced field-craft etc. Summary of Umpire Observations

So far this season I have observed 43 of the 49 umpires who have stood in games this season. The umpires who were not observed this season were:

- Graeme Clifton – only stood 2 games
- Bryan Climas – stood 2 games
- Gary Dawson – new umpire – stood few games
- Stuart Grocock – Sydney umpire, stood a few games
- Simon Lightbody – Sydney Umpire, stood a few games
- Ron Reinhard – the observer – stood about 8 games

Most umpires are performing well, and I have only been aware of a few new umpires making head movement as the ball is being delivered. This has generally been resolved by advising those umpires to consider standing further back from the wicket. Overall I believe that most umpires exhibit the correct umpiring process and signals most of the time.

General comments from Captains and Club Officials

As a general comment most captains are quite happy with the performance of most umpires most of the time.

Summary of Confidential Captains Reports

This season I have been encouraging clubs and captains to complete a confidential report on umpires by the Tuesday after each game. In addition I have advised clubs and captains that their reports are an important source of feedback on umpire's performance. Captains have been asked to base their assessment on the umpires process; rather than simply focusing on differences of opinion related to in's and out's.

By the end of the season a total of 947 reports have been completed on 49 umpires; comprising:

- 199 for 18 umpires for 1st grade games and a further 56 for 18 umpires for Konica T20 games;
- 185 for 29 umpires for 2nd grade games and a further 63 for 16 umpires for Div2 T20 games;
- 123 for 28 umpires for 3rd grade games and a further 38 for 13 umpires for Div3 games;
- 84 for 25 umpires for 4th grade games and a further 42 for 11 umpires for Div4 games;
- 55 for 19 umpires for 5th grade games and
- 102 for 22 umpires for women's games

Reports are currently outstanding from 85 captains; 8 of these reports relate to games concluded before the end of December 2014.

Individual umpires have been the subject of between 1 and 41 captain's reports; with the average for individual umpires across all games varying between 3.0 and 4.37. Captains rate each umpire on seven attributes and award scores between 1 and 5 for each attribute. The scoring system awards 1 for poor performance up to 5 for excellent performance. Captains have been advised that a score of 3 (good) should be awarded where they believe the umpire was at the level that should be expected for their grade / competition.

Several umpires have received scores of less than 3 for several attributes in some games; but not all captains rating umpires in this category are routinely providing a commentary to justify this score.

Where captains award a score of less than 3 for any attribute I have been making a point of following up with the captains and club officials to ensure that I have been made fully aware of the issues / concerns the captain wishes to raise with an umpires performance. Significant recent feedback has included that umpires:

- Are too quick to award an out decision (especially LBW's)
- Make inconsistent calls of wides (both between an umpire pair and by a specific umpire)
- Are slow to get into position square of the wicket (at the bowlers end) to judge a run-out
- Appear to be indecisive when asked to make a decision
- Not appearing to have been paying attention (may have thought the ball was or would soon become dead and were not awake to a stumping / stealing of a quick run / run-out play)
- Not communicating well or effectively with players and/or captains (some captains have reported that umpires were a little gruff or even arrogant)

- Talking too much and at times confusing players/captains with some of their chatter or comments
- Not knowing or being unable to apply the competition playing conditions (including number of overs for the day, times for intervals etc.)
- Not being able to count to 6 legal deliveries in an over
- Moving forward or backward as the bowler is about to deliver (bowlers end umpire).

As I become aware of captains concerns I have attempted to schedule an observation of the identified umpire and have provided specific feedback based on my observations to that umpire. Umpires WILL NOT be made aware of any scores awarded by a captain or of specific feedback provided by a captain.

Post-Match Reports

Post-Match paperwork MUST to be submitted to Ben Ryan (Cricket ACT) by noon on the Tuesday after the game concludes. Copies should also be sent to Andrew Koprass (only if you wish to receive payment for your attendance at a game) and to me as the Umpires Observer so I can reconcile captains reports on umpires with the post-match discussion of the game. I continued to receive reports more than 5 days after the due date; and I've sent emails to some umpires asking for a copy of the post-match report.

New Umpires

Generally umpires who have been appointed with a new (Level 1 umpire) have:

- Provide some initial advice and feedback on field-craft issues – positioning, signalling, taking time to consider appeals, not being flustered by players making appeals etc.
- Complete a report on the new umpire (available on the web page), discuss the report with the new umpire and forward the report to the new umpire and to me as the umpire's observer. Reports on new Level 1 umpires need only be forwarded to the Umpires' Observer (not to Andrew Shelley).

Forum for New Umpires

During the 2013/14 season the Training Manager, Umpires Observer and Appointments Manager convened a short meeting for new (1st year) umpires after the close of the monthly meeting. This forum operated again this year but was not as effective due to the inability of the convenors to attend all monthly meetings. It is recommended that this forum be convened again during the 2015/16 season and that the High Performance Manager or Chair/ Secretary be delegated to substitute if any of the 3 nominated convenors are unable to attend any monthly meeting

UMPIRES' OBSERVER**

UNDER 17 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

In December, I had the honour of representing the Council at the National U17 Championships in Hobart. It was a great honour for me in my second year of umpiring.

The Match Officials were managed by Bob Parry (Cricket Australia Umpire Educator) and assisted by Ian Lock (Ex Panel Umpire). There was sporadic interjection from members of the UHPP. These included Bob Stratford & David Talalla who proved to be great additions to the group

On the third night we had a dinner with 3 of the current CA panel umpires. These were Ash Barrow, Shawn Craig (who was both standing in the current shield game at the time (Tasmania v South Australia) along with Michael Graham-Smith who is a Tasmanian who currently lives in Hobart. This was a great evening which was very sociable and relaxed. Speaking to the panel members they are human like us with similar thoughts and needs of reassurance.

The most rewarding of the whole experience was meeting, standing with, talking and learning from the 7 other umpires from other states. They were an excellent bunch of individuals as well as being very good umpires. I had great respect for the number of years' experience and wealth of knowledge they carried from their resultant experiences.

There were a few idiosyncrasies that caught my eye. A Victorian umpire who had a two to go signal like a matador from Spain and another umpire who signalled four like a conductor controlling a 100 piece orchestra. Being a people watcher most of my life, it was 'cinema gold' as I absorbed the complexities of the umpiring world while sighting fresh techniques and differing characteristics of match management.

This learning didn't just occur on-field. The eight of us spent a great deal of time together off-field, both socially and in CA-run professional development sessions. During the formal sessions much time was devoted to video feedback and analysis, where we all discovered that the CA cameras don't miss much once the umpires leave the relative safety of the change rooms. The Development Day also covered finger speed and body language as well as positioning around the crease.

Discussions also centred on goal setting and the concept of team preparation, with examples given of how ICC match officials prepare as a team for series and tournaments challenging all of our beliefs regarding just when teamwork should begin for us as umpires. After this tournament, we were all left in no doubt that success as umpires depends on teamwork from the moment one is informed of one's appointments.

The weather was very average for the whole two weeks with many games being played through drizzle and freezing (8 degrees) conditions. It was the first time in my career that I umpired in 4 layers of clothing (and I was still cold). These weather conditions were abrasive and it required strong concentration skills over a 7 hour period. However being originally from England it was like being back in the UK and somewhat familiar to me.

There was plenty of paperwork to keep you busy late at night with CA targets and reviews required for all of the six matches over a 12 day period. This paper work was supplemented with additional examples of final hour calculations and last day scenarios. This was very handy as I had only umpired in a handful of two day games prior to the tournament

NSW Metropolitan finished the Championships as deserved winners, with a strong bowling line up which was capable of ripping through many a batting order. South Australia was awarded the Spirit of Cricket award. International James Faulkner spoke of the qualities necessary to move to become a successful international athlete, while Greg Chappell and Graeme Hick looked on in their capacity as coaches and talent identification managers.

I would like to extend a very sincere thank you to Terry Keel and the appointments committee for putting my name forward for selection in these Championships. I hope to complete my experience of umpiring in a CA pathway tournament environment by sharing freely some of my technical skills and inside knowledge of the requirements needed to reach the next level.

NEW ZEALAND UNDER 21 WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

In December of 2014 I had the privilege of joining five other ladies in umpiring at the U21 Women's Championships at Lincoln in New Zealand. Joining me in officiating at this tournament were Claire Polosak, Helen Atai, Kathleen Cross, Kim Cotton and Diana Venter. This was the first time an all-female crew has officiated at this tournament.

The tournament was held at the New Zealand Cricket High Performance Centre at Lincoln University, located close to Christchurch. The facility has the NZ Cricket offices, an indoor training venue, three residential pavilions – where the umpires and the scorers bunked for the week – and three quality fields for play. This venue is used for many high level matches including New Zealand domestic men's and women's competitions and national tournaments.

Six provinces supplied teams for the tournament, the with player ages ranging from 13 to 20. These provinces were Otago, Wellington, Auckland, Northern Districts, Central Districts and Canterbury. Each team played well within the spirit of cricket and there were many excellent talents displaying their skills. In the end, the girls from Auckland proved too good for their opposition, taking out the title for 2014.

All in all, the experience was a once in a lifetime opportunity that I am incredibly grateful for. It has helped with my development as an umpire overall. The experience of standing in games with umpires of the calibre of Kathy Cross was invaluable.

In addition to the U21 tournament in New Zealand I had the opportunity to umpire at the U18 Women's National Championship held in Ballarat during January 2015. I was one of eight umpires at this tournament. I was again joined by Claire Polosak and the rest of the team were Ashlee Kovalevs, Karen Naylor, Neal Cotgrove, Luke Edwards, Nick Ferns and Farukh Rahman.
